arms	Distinctive emblems or devices originally borne on shields in battle and now forming the heraldic insignia of families, corporations, or countries. <i>Arms exports.</i>
arms cache	Weapons considered collectively.
arms depot	Weapons considered collectively.
<u>array</u>	An arrangement of troops. <i>Several arrays of solar panels will help provide power.</i>
assortment	The act of distributing things into classes or categories of the same type. <i>The room was filled with an assortment of clothes.</i>
battery	An artillery subunit of guns, men, and vehicles. <i>Battery farming.</i>
collection	A sum of money raised during a church or charity collection. <i>A rambling collection of houses.</i>
magazine	A business firm that publishes magazines. <i>A women s weekly magazine.</i>
ordnance depot	Military supplies.
range	The compass of a person's voice or a musical instrument. <i>On dude ranches tourists put on crisp new western gear to ride the range.</i>
weaponry	Weapons regarded collectively. <i>Nuclear weaponry.</i>
weapons	A means of persuading or arguing. <i>He used all his conversational weapons.</i>

A military force equipped for war.

(used of plants and animals) furnished with bristles and thorns.

*A lion rampant argent **armed** and langued azure.*

armory

A collection of resources.

*He dipped into his intellectual **armory** to find an answer.*

arms	Weapons; armaments. <i>Arms exports.</i>
artillery	A means of persuading or arguing. <i>Each corps included two regiments of field artillery.</i>
bomb	Attack a place or object with a bomb or bombs. <i>That bomb of an old movie.</i>
<u>bombard</u>	Throw bombs at or attack with bombs. <i>The city was bombarded by federal forces.</i>
bombardier	The member of a bomber crew responsible for using the bombsight and releasing the bombs on the target.
bomber	A bomber jacket. <i>Manny hand rolled a couple of bombers.</i>
<u>brigade</u>	Form into a brigade. <i>They thought the speech too closely brigaded with illegal action.</i>
brigadier	A rank of officer in the British army, above colonel and below major general.
cannon	Make a cannon shot. <i>The couple behind almost cannoned into us.</i>
cantonment	A military garrison or camp.
corps	A body of people associated together. <i>At 9 30 a m the press corps was handed what looked to be a routine list of orders.</i>
defense	(military) military action or resources protecting a country against potential enemies. <i>Defense against hurricanes is an urgent problem.</i>
detonate	Explode or cause to explode. <i>Two other bombs failed to detonate.</i>
explosive	Able or likely to shatter violently or burst apart. <i>Explosive violence.</i>
firearm	A portable gun. <i>Jones pleaded guilty to possessing a firearm with criminal intent.</i>
<u>gun</u>	Shoot with a gun. <i>It s encouraging to note that Schwarzenegger wasn t born with massive guns.</i>
gunner	A serviceman in the artillery.
implode	Collapse or cause to collapse violently inwards. <i>He lost money when the market imploded.</i>

lancet	A lancet arch or window. <i>A lancet clock.</i>
<u>military</u>	Characteristic of or associated with soldiers or the military. <i>As a young man he joined the military and pursued a career in the Army.</i>
missile	A rocket carrying a warhead of conventional or nuclear explosives; may be ballistic or directed by remote control. <i>One of the players was hit on the head by a missile thrown by a spectator.</i>
munitio	Military weapons ammunition equipment and stores. <i>Munitio factories.</i>
nuclear	Denoting relating to or powered by the energy released in nuclear fission or fusion. <i>Nuclear division.</i>
ordnance	Large but transportable armament. <i>The gun was a brand new piece of ordnance.</i>
turret	A rotating holder for tools, especially on a lathe. <i>A castle with fairy tale turrets.</i>
<u>weapon</u>	Any instrument or instrumentality used in fighting or hunting. <i>He used all his conversational weapons.</i>
