<b>arms</b>	Distinctive emblems or devices originally borne on shields in battle and now forming the heraldic insignia of families, corporations, or countries. <i>Arms exports.</i>
<b>arms cache</b>	Weapons considered collectively.
<b>arms depot</b>	Weapons considered collectively.
<b><u>array</u></b>	An arrangement of troops. <i>Several <b>arrays</b> of solar panels will help provide power.</i>
<b>assortment</b>	The act of distributing things into classes or categories of the same type. <i>The room was filled with an <b>assortment</b> of clothes.</i>
<b>battery</b>	An artillery subunit of guns, men, and vehicles. <i><b>Battery</b> farming.</i>
<b>collection</b>	A sum of money raised during a church or charity collection. <i>A rambling <b>collection</b> of houses.</i>
<b>magazine</b>	A business firm that publishes magazines. <i>A women s weekly <b>magazine</b>.</i>
<b>ordnance depot</b>	Military supplies.
<b>range</b>	The compass of a person's voice or a musical instrument. <i>On dude ranches tourists put on crisp new western gear to ride the <b>range</b>.</i>
<b>weaponry</b>	Weapons regarded collectively. <i>Nuclear <b>weaponry</b>.</i>
<b>weapons</b>	A means of persuading or arguing. <i>He used all his conversational <b>weapons</b>.</i>

### armory

A collection of resources.

*He dipped into his intellectual **armory** to find an answer.*

<b>arms</b>	Weapons; armaments. <i>Arms exports.</i>
<b>artillery</b>	A means of persuading or arguing. <i>Each corps included two regiments of field <b>artillery</b>.</i>
<b>bomb</b>	Attack a place or object with a bomb or bombs. <i>That <b>bomb</b> of an old movie.</i>
<b><u>bombard</u></b>	Throw bombs at or attack with bombs. <i>The city was <b>bombarded</b> by federal forces.</i>
<b>bombardier</b>	The member of a bomber crew responsible for using the bombsight and releasing the bombs on the target.
<b>bomber</b>	A bomber jacket. <i>Manny hand rolled a couple of <b>bombers</b>.</i>
<b><u>brigade</u></b>	Form into a brigade. <i>They thought the speech too closely <b>brigaded</b> with illegal action.</i>
<b>brigadier</b>	A rank of officer in the British army, above colonel and below major general.
<b>cannon</b>	Make a cannon shot. <i>The couple behind almost <b>cannonned</b> into us.</i>
<b>cantonment</b>	A military garrison or camp.
<b>corps</b>	A body of people associated together. <i>At 9 30 a m the press <b>corps</b> was handed what looked to be a routine list of orders.</i>
<b>defense</b>	(military) military action or resources protecting a country against potential enemies. <i><b>Defense</b> against hurricanes is an urgent problem.</i>
<b>detonate</b>	Explode or cause to explode. <i>Two other bombs failed to <b>detonate</b>.</i>
<b>explosive</b>	Able or likely to shatter violently or burst apart. <i><b>Explosive</b> violence.</i>
<b>firearm</b>	A portable gun. <i>Jones pleaded guilty to possessing a <b>firearm</b> with criminal intent.</i>
<b><u>gun</u></b>	Shoot with a gun. <i>It s encouraging to note that Schwarzenegger wasn t born with massive <b>guns</b>.</i>
<b>gunner</b>	A serviceman in the artillery.
<b>implode</b>	Collapse or cause to collapse violently inwards. <i>He lost money when the market <b>imploded</b>.</i>

<b>lancet</b>	A lancet arch or window. <i>A <b>lancet</b> clock.</i>
<b><u>military</u></b>	Characteristic of or associated with soldiers or the military. <i>As a young man he joined the <b>military</b> and pursued a career in the Army.</i>
<b>missile</b>	A rocket carrying a warhead of conventional or nuclear explosives; may be ballistic or directed by remote control. <i>One of the players was hit on the head by a <b>missile</b> thrown by a spectator.</i>
<b>munition</b>	Military weapons ammunition equipment and stores. <i><b>Munition</b> factories.</i>
<b>nuclear</b>	Denoting relating to or powered by the energy released in nuclear fission or fusion. <i><b>Nuclear</b> division.</i>
<b>ordnance</b>	Large but transportable armament. <i>The gun was a brand new piece of <b>ordnance</b>.</i>
<b>turret</b>	A rotating holder for tools, especially on a lathe. <i>A castle with fairy tale <b>turrets</b>.</i>
<b><u>weapon</u></b>	Any instrument or instrumentality used in fighting or hunting. <i>He used all his conversational <b>weapons</b>.</i>
