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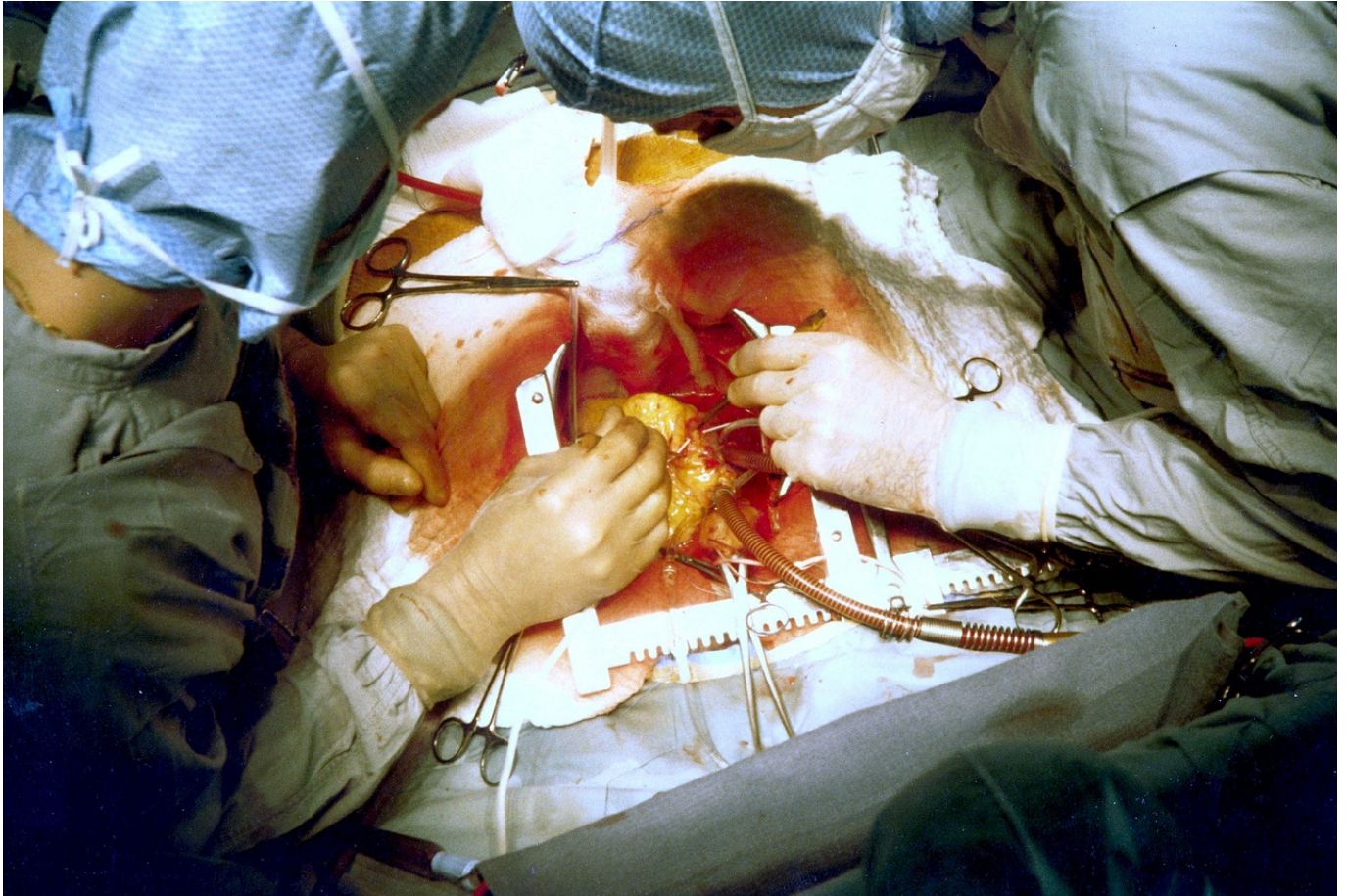

## Artery as a Noun

### Definitions of "Artery" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “artery” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A blood vessel that carries blood from the heart to the body.*
- *Any of the muscular-walled tubes forming part of the circulation system by which blood (mainly that which has been oxygenated) is conveyed from the heart to all parts of the body.*
- *A major thoroughfare that bears important traffic.*
- *An important route in a system of roads, rivers, or railway lines.*



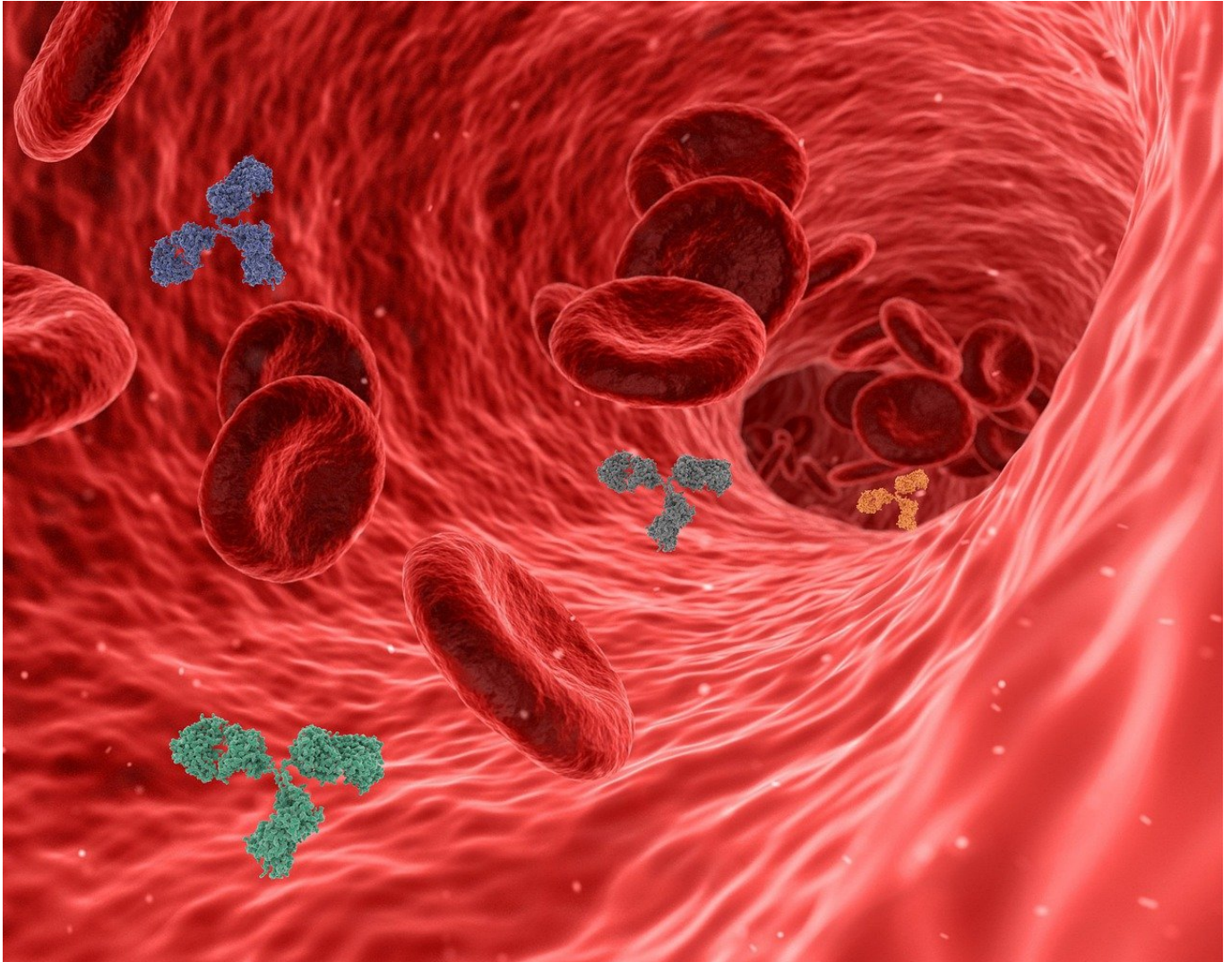
## Synonyms of "Artery" as a noun (9 Words)

- arteria** A blood vessel that carries blood from the heart to the body.
- high road** A public secondary school usually including grades 9 through 12.
- highway** (chiefly in official use) a public road.  
*The **highway** to success.*
- main line** A principal pipe in a system that distributes water or gas or electricity or that collects sewage.
- main road** Any very large body of (salt) water.
- main route** Any very large body of (salt) water.
- trunk line** The body excluding the head and neck and limbs.
- trunk road** The main stem of a tree; usually covered with bark; the bole is usually the part that is commercially useful for lumber.
- trunk route** Compartment in an automobile that carries luggage or shopping or tools.

## Associations of "Artery" (30 Words)

<b>airway</b>	A ventilating passage in a mine. <i>He kept the man s <b>airway</b> clear and blood circulating.</i>
<b>aorta</b>	The large trunk artery that carries blood from the left ventricle of the heart to branch arteries.
<b>arterial</b>	Denoting an important route in a system of roads, railway lines, or rivers. <i>One of the main <b>arterial</b> routes from York.</i>
<b>bifocal</b>	A pair of glasses with bifocal lenses. <i><b>Bifocal</b> eyeglasses.</i>

<b>bifurcate</b>	Divided into two branches or forks. <i>The road <b>bifurcated</b>.</i>
<b>blood</b>	An internal bodily fluid in invertebrates which performs a similar function to blood in humans and other vertebrates. <i>She must have Irish <b>blood</b> in her.</i>
<b>bloodstream</b>	The blood flowing through the circulatory system.
<b>breathe</b>	Give an impression of (something). <i>He <b>breathed</b> out heavily.</i>
<b>breathing</b>	A sign in Greek or indicating the presence of an aspirate rough breathing or the absence of an aspirate smooth breathing at the beginning of a word. <i>The heavy <b>breathing</b> person on the telephone.</i>
<b>bronchus</b>	Either of the two main branches of the trachea.
<b>capillary</b>	A tube of small internal diameter holds liquid by capillary action. <i>A <b>capillary</b> tube.</i>
<b>cardiovascular</b>	Relating to the heart and blood vessels. <i>Increased risk of death from <b>cardiovascular</b> disease.</i>
<b>choking</b>	The act of suffocating (someone) by constricting the windpipe. <i>No evidence that the <b>choking</b> was done by the accused.</i>
<b>coronary</b>	Obstruction of blood flow in a coronary artery by a blood clot thrombus.
<b>disease</b>	A particular quality or disposition regarded as adversely affecting a person or group of people. <i>We are suffering from the British <b>disease</b> of self deprecation.</i>
<b>embolism</b>	Obstruction of an artery, typically by a clot of blood or an air bubble. <i>Causes of cerebral <b>embolism</b>.</i>
<b>esophagus</b>	The passage between the pharynx and the stomach.
<b>hypertension</b>	Abnormally high blood pressure.
<b>inject</b>	Take by injection. <i><b>Inject</b> the foam and allow it to expand.</i>
<b>jugular</b>	Of the neck or throat. <i>He always goes for the <b>jugular</b>.</i>
<b>lung</b>	An open space in a town or city, where people can breathe fresher air. <i>The city had to be given <b>lungs</b> in the shape of open spaces squares parks and gardens.</i>
<b>lymphatic</b>	Relating to lymph or its secretion. <i>The fluid is drained by the <b>lymphatics</b> and returned to the circulation.</i>
<b>nasal</b>	A nasal speech sound. <i>A whining <b>nasal</b> voice.</i>

<b>obstructive</b>	Causing a blockage or obstruction. <i>All tubing should be cleared of <b>obstructive</b> algae and detritus.</i>
<b>pharyngeal</b>	A pharyngeal consonant.
<b>portal</b>	A doorway, gate, or other entrance, especially a large and imposing one. <i>A <b>portal</b> typically has search engines and free email and chat rooms etc.</i>
<b>pulmonary</b>	Relating to or affecting the lungs. <i><b>Pulmonary</b> blood flow.</i>
<b>tonsil</b>	Either of two small masses of lymphoid tissue in the throat, one on each side of the root of the tongue.
<b>vein</b>	Make a veinlike pattern. <i>He closes his article in a somewhat humorous <b>vein</b>.</i>
<b>venous</b>	Of or contained in or performing the function of the veins.
