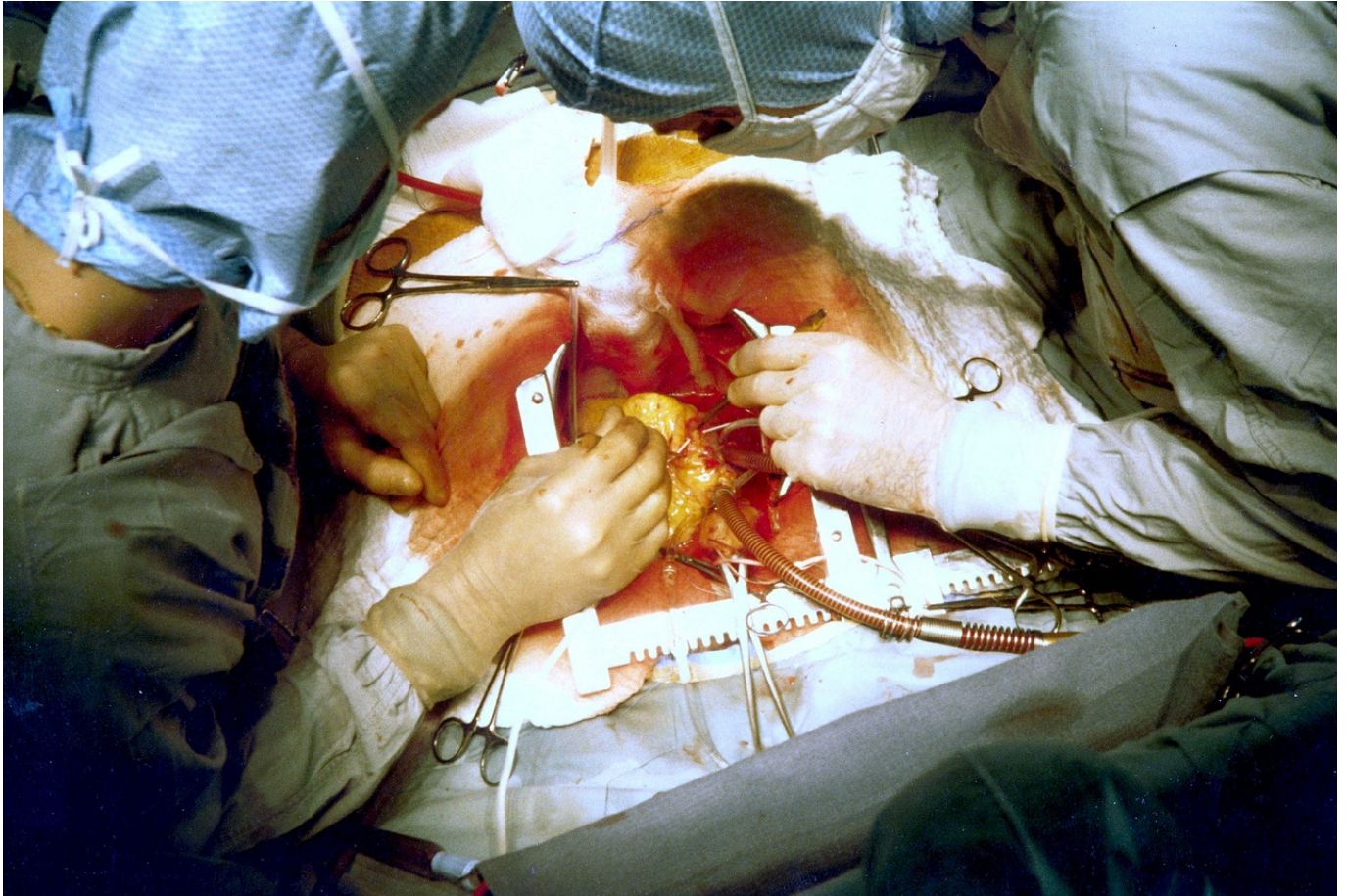

Artery as a Noun

Definitions of "Artery" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “artery” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A blood vessel that carries blood from the heart to the body.*
- *Any of the muscular-walled tubes forming part of the circulation system by which blood (mainly that which has been oxygenated) is conveyed from the heart to all parts of the body.*
- *A major thoroughfare that bears important traffic.*
- *An important route in a system of roads, rivers, or railway lines.*



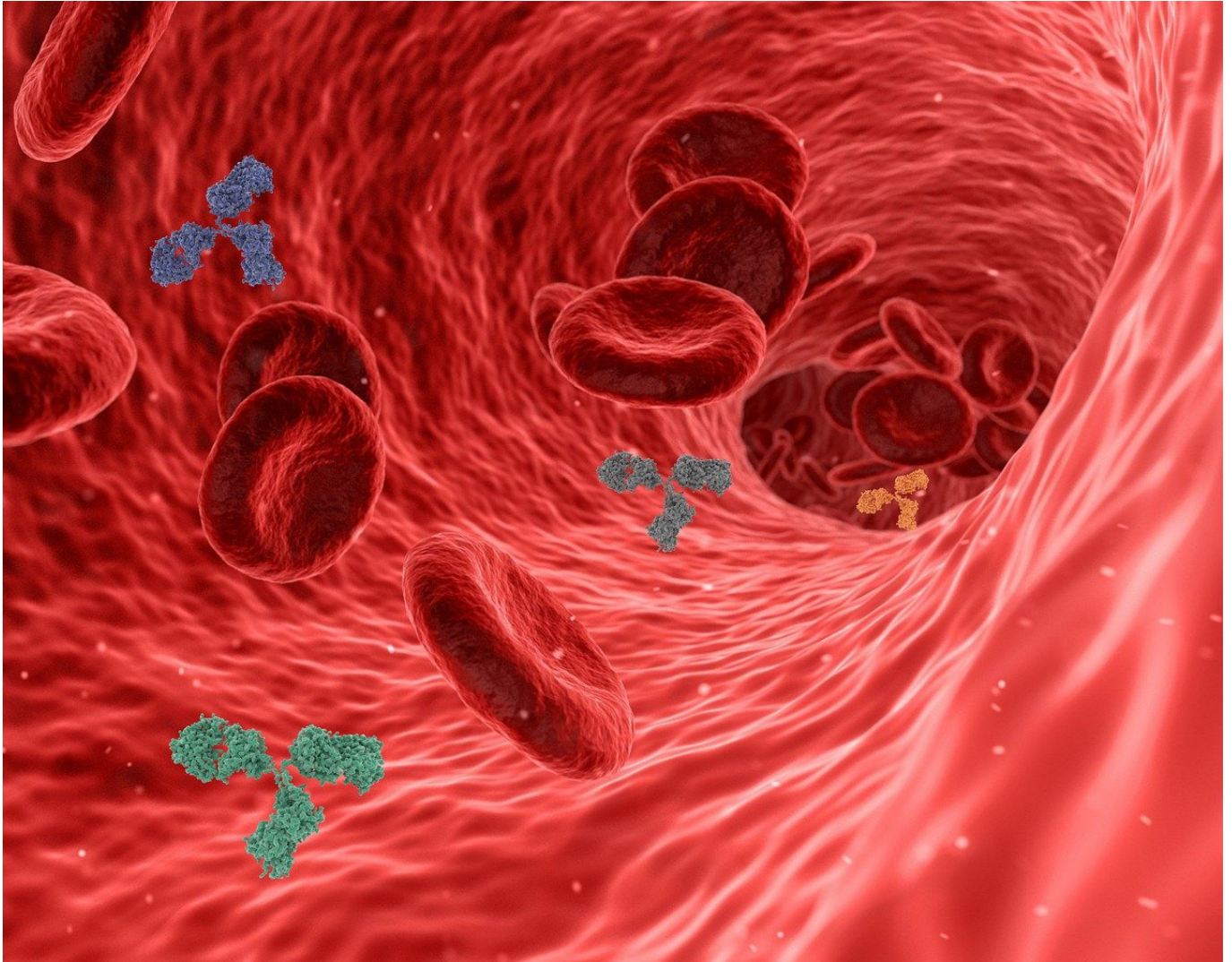
Synonyms of "Artery" as a noun (9 Words)

- arteria** A blood vessel that carries blood from the heart to the body.
- high road** A public secondary school usually including grades 9 through 12.
- highway** (chiefly in official use) a public road.
*The **highway** to success.*
- main line** A principal pipe in a system that distributes water or gas or electricity or that collects sewage.
- main road** Any very large body of (salt) water.
- main route** Any very large body of (salt) water.
- trunk line** The body excluding the head and neck and limbs.
- trunk road** The main stem of a tree; usually covered with bark; the bole is usually the part that is commercially useful for lumber.
- trunk route** Compartment in an automobile that carries luggage or shopping or tools.



Usage Examples of "Artery" as a noun

- *George Street, main artery of Edinburgh's Golden Mile.*



Associations of "Artery" (30 Words)

- airway** A ventilating passage in a mine.
*He kept the man's **airway** clear and blood circulating.*
- aorta** The large trunk artery that carries blood from the left ventricle of the heart to branch arteries.
- arterial** Denoting an important route in a system of roads, railway lines, or rivers.
*One of the main **arterial** routes from York.*
- bifocal** A pair of glasses with bifocal lenses.
***Bifocal** eyeglasses.*

bifurcate	Divided into two branches or forks. <i>The road bifurcated.</i>
blood	An internal bodily fluid in invertebrates which performs a similar function to blood in humans and other vertebrates. <i>She must have Irish blood in her.</i>
bloodstream	The blood flowing through the circulatory system.
breathe	Give an impression of (something). <i>He breathed out heavily.</i>
breathing	A sign in Greek or indicating the presence of an aspirate rough breathing or the absence of an aspirate smooth breathing at the beginning of a word. <i>The heavy breathing person on the telephone.</i>
bronchus	Either of the two main branches of the trachea.
capillary	A tube of small internal diameter holds liquid by capillary action. <i>A capillary tube.</i>
cardiovascular	Relating to the heart and blood vessels. <i>Increased risk of death from cardiovascular disease.</i>
choking	The act of suffocating (someone) by constricting the windpipe. <i>No evidence that the choking was done by the accused.</i>
coronary	Obstruction of blood flow in a coronary artery by a blood clot thrombus.
disease	A particular quality or disposition regarded as adversely affecting a person or group of people. <i>We are suffering from the British disease of self deprecation.</i>
embolism	Obstruction of an artery, typically by a clot of blood or an air bubble. <i>Causes of cerebral embolism.</i>
esophagus	The passage between the pharynx and the stomach.
hypertension	Abnormally high blood pressure.
inject	Take by injection. <i>Inject the foam and allow it to expand.</i>
jugular	Of the neck or throat. <i>He always goes for the jugular.</i>
lung	An open space in a town or city, where people can breathe fresher air. <i>The city had to be given lungs in the shape of open spaces squares parks and gardens.</i>
lymphatic	Relating to lymph or its secretion. <i>The fluid is drained by the lymphatics and returned to the circulation.</i>
nasal	A nasal speech sound. <i>A whining nasal voice.</i>

obstructive	Causing a blockage or obstruction. <i>All tubing should be cleared of obstructive algae and detritus.</i>
pharyngeal	A pharyngeal consonant.
portal	A doorway, gate, or other entrance, especially a large and imposing one. <i>A portal typically has search engines and free email and chat rooms etc.</i>
pulmonary	Relating to or affecting the lungs. <i>Pulmonary blood flow.</i>
tonsil	Either of two small masses of lymphoid tissue in the throat, one on each side of the root of the tongue.
vein	Make a veinlike pattern. <i>He closes his article in a somewhat humorous vein.</i>
venous	Of or contained in or performing the function of the veins.
