Definitions of "Article" as a noun

- *(grammar) a determiner that may indicate the specificity of reference of a noun phrase.*
- *A separate clause or paragraph of a legal document or agreement, typically one outlining a single rule or regulation.*
- *Nonfictional prose forming an independent part of a publication.*
- *One of a class of artifacts.*
- *A piece of writing included with others in a newspaper, magazine, or other publication.*
- *The terms on which crew members take service on a ship.*
- *The definite or indefinite article.*
- *A period of training with a firm as a solicitor, architect, surveyor, or accountant.*
- *A determiner that may indicate the specificity of reference of a noun phrase.*
- *A particular item or object.*
- *A separate section of a legal document (as a statute or contract or will).*

account	A short account of the news. <i>She turned her writing skills to good account.</i>
analysis	The identification and measurement of the chemical constituents of a substance or specimen. <i>Samples are sent to the laboratory for analysis.</i>
artefact	Something observed in a scientific investigation or experiment that is not naturally present but occurs as a result of the preparative or investigative procedure. <i>Gold and silver artefacts.</i>
bit	The cutting part of a drill usually pointed and threaded and is replaceable in a brace or bitstock or drill press. <i>Miranda could go off and do her theatrical bit.</i>
<u>clause</u>	(grammar) an expression including a subject and predicate functioning as a part of a complex sentence.

<u>column</u>	Anything that approximates the shape of a column or tower. <i>Detail your expenses in the left hand column.</i>
commentary	An expression of opinions or offering of explanations about an event or situation. <i>A commentary on the Old Testament.</i>
commodity	Articles of commerce. <i>Commodity markets.</i>
<u>composition</u>	A sum paid in lieu of a larger debt. <i>Chopin's most romantic compositions.</i>
<u>discourse</u>	A formal discussion of a topic in speech or writing. <i>An imagined discourse between two people.</i>
disquisition	An elaborate analytical or explanatory essay or discussion. <i>Nothing can kill a radio show quicker than a disquisition on intertextual analysis.</i>
division	A group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>Two infantry divisions were held in reserve.</i>
essay	A short piece of writing on a particular subject. <i>A misjudged essay in job preservation.</i>
feature	A newspaper or magazine article or a broadcast programme devoted to the treatment of a particular topic, typically at length. <i>A dark haired man with strong regular features.</i>
heading	A horizontal passage made in preparation for building a tunnel. <i>The heading seemed to have little to do with the text.</i>
item	An entry in an account. <i>They reduced the price on many items.</i>
object	A thing external to the thinking mind or subject. <i>Small objects such as shells.</i>
paper	The physical object that is the product of a newspaper publisher. <i>He read his newspaper at breakfast.</i>
paragraph	A distinct section of a piece of writing, usually dealing with a single theme and indicated by a new line, indentation, or numbering. <i>The concluding paragraph.</i>
part	A melody or other constituent of harmony assigned to a particular voice or instrument in a musical work. <i>Those of you who jet off to foreign parts for your holidays.</i>
<u>passage</u>	A narrow way allowing access between buildings or to different rooms within a building a passageway. <i>I booked a passage on the next ship.</i>

piece	Game equipment consisting of an object used in playing certain board games. <i>She bought a lovely piece of china.</i>
piece of merchandise	A portion of a natural object.
piece of writing	An instance of some kind.
point	A decimal point. <i>A power point.</i>
<u>portion</u>	The part or share of an estate given or descending by law to an heir. <i>A portion of ice cream.</i>
product	Commercially manufactured articles, especially recordings, viewed collectively. <i>The product of 2 and 3 is 6.</i>
report	An employee who reports to another employee. <i>His father signed his report card.</i>
review	Practice intended to polish performance or refresh the memory. <i>All areas of the company will come under review.</i>
<u>section</u>	A separation by cutting. <i>The brass section.</i>
segment	The part of a line included between two points. <i>Finished the final segment of the road.</i>
story	A plot or storyline. <i>Having such information is useful but it is not the whole story.</i>
study	A room used for reading and writing and studying. <i>The study of English.</i>
subdivision	A section of a section; a part of a part; i.e., a part of something already divided. <i>Such an arrangement offers the possibility of subdivision into a series of identical spaces.</i>
<u>subsection</u>	A section of a section; a part of a part; i.e., a part of something already divided. <i>Each chapter has a different theme and numerous subsections.</i>
thing	Used to express one's disapproval of or contempt for something. <i>Reading isn't my thing.</i>
<u>tract</u>	An indefinitely large extent of something. <i>It took courage to privatize vast tracts of nationalized industry.</i>

treatise

A written work dealing formally and systematically with a subject.
*His **treatise** on Scottish political theory.*

unit

The smallest measure of investment in a unit trust.
*Fifty **units** of electricity.*

Associations of "Article" (30 Words)

<u>annotate</u>	Add notes to (a text or diagram) giving explanation or comment. <i>He annotated on what his teacher had written.</i>
annotation	A note by way of explanation or comment added to a text or diagram. <i>Marginal annotations.</i>
<u>book</u>	The notebook in which a referee writes the names of players who are cautioned for foul play. <i>The agent booked tickets to the show for the whole family.</i>
caret	A mark used by an author or editor to indicate where something is to be inserted into a text.
citation	A summons that commands the appearance of a party at a proceeding. <i>A traffic citation.</i>
<u>cite</u>	Advance evidence for. <i>The writ cited only four of the signatories of the petition.</i>

comment	A written explanation or commentary. <i>He commented the paper of his colleague.</i>
contributor	A causal factor in the existence or occurrence of something. <i>Hunt was the largest contributor of hymns to these collections.</i>
define	Mark out the boundary or limits of. <i>The dictionary defines it as a type of pasture.</i>
<u>descriptive</u>	Serving or seeking to describe. <i>Descriptive grammar.</i>
<u>dictum</u>	An authoritative declaration. <i>The old dictum might be right.</i>
gazette	Announce or publish something in an official gazette. <i>A gazetted holiday.</i>
<u>journal</u>	Write in a journal or diary. <i>While abroad he had kept a journal.</i>
lexicographer	A person who compiles dictionaries.
magazine	A business firm that publishes magazines. <i>He works for a magazine.</i>
<u>maxim</u>	English inventor (born in the United States) who invented the Maxim gun that was used in World War I (1840-1916). <i>The maxim that actions speak louder than words.</i>
mention	Make mention of. <i>He is still regularly mentioned as a possible secretary of state.</i>
newspaper	The organization responsible for producing a particular newspaper. <i>She left her muddy boots on a piece of newspaper.</i>
notation	A note or annotation. <i>Algebraic notation.</i>
obituary	A notice of someone's death; usually includes a short biography. <i>It is premature to write the obituary of British science.</i>
publisher	The proprietor of a newspaper. <i>A commercial music publisher.</i>
quotation	A passage or expression that is quoted or cited. <i>A quotation from Bartok's Fourth String Quartet.</i>
<u>quote</u>	A passage or expression that is quoted or cited. <i>Quotes for North Sea Brent were rising.</i>
reader	A proofreader. <i>A meter reader.</i>

readership	The audience reached by written communications (books or magazines or newspapers etc). <i>The magazine has a readership of just 65 000.</i>
reference	A short note recognizing a source of information or of a quoted passage. <i>He made reference to the enormous power of the mass media.</i>
remark	Notice or comment. <i>The judges remarked on the high standard of the entries.</i>
reporting	The news as presented by reporters for newspapers or radio or television.
sentence	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>He was under sentence of death.</i>
writing	Handwriting. <i>The doctor's writing was illegible.</i>
