Associations of "Articulating" (30 Words)

aloud	Loudly. <i>Cried aloud for help.</i>
dah	The longer of the two telegraphic signals used in Morse code.
declamatory	Ostentatiously lofty in style. <i>A long declamatory speech.</i>
elocution	An expert manner of speaking involving control of voice and gesture. <i>Lessons in singing and elocution.</i>
eloquence	Fluent or persuasive speaking or writing. <i>A preacher of great power and eloquence.</i>
eloquent	Expressing yourself readily, clearly, effectively. <i>The bus journey alone is eloquent of class inequality.</i>
eloquently	In an articulate manner. <i>He expressed his ideas eloquently.</i>
enunciate	Express or state clearly. <i>She enunciated each word slowly.</i>
eulogy	A speech or piece of writing that praises someone or something highly, especially a tribute to someone who has just died. <i>A eulogy to the Queen Mother.</i>
express	Serve as a means for expressing something. <i>Many of the laboratory animals express the trait.</i>
flowing	(of a line or contour) smoothly continuous. <i>A flowing prose style.</i>
fluent	Able to express oneself easily and articulately. <i>He spoke fluent Spanish.</i>
formulate	Elaborate, as of theories and hypotheses. <i>Use special effects paints that are formulated for the task.</i>

memorize	Commit to memory; learn by heart. <i>He memorized thousands of verses.</i>
monologue	A long utterance by one person (especially one that prevents others from participating in the conversation). <i>He was reciting some of the great monologues of Shakespeare.</i>
oration	The style or manner in which an oration is given. <i>Pericles famous funeral oration.</i>
orator	An official speaking for a university on ceremonial occasions. <i>A theatrically effective orator.</i>
oratory	Addressing an audience formally (usually a long and rhetorical address and often pompous). <i>He loved the sound of his own oratory.</i>
persuasive	Good at persuading someone to do or believe something through reasoning or the use of temptation. <i>A persuasive argument.</i>
pronounce	Speak pronounce or utter in a certain way. <i>Allow history to pronounce the verdict.</i>
recitation	Systematic training by multiple repetitions. <i>The recitation of traditional poems.</i>
recite	Recite in elocution. <i>He recited passages of Dante.</i>
rhetorician	A person who delivers a speech or oration. <i>They re ready to listen to any smooth tongued rhetorician.</i>
sing	Deliver by singing. <i>My brother sings very well.</i>
speaker	The presiding officer in a legislative assembly, especially the House of Commons. <i>The speaker at commencement.</i>
talker	A person who speaks or converses, often in a specified way. <i>She s quite a talker conversing and arguing with Henry.</i>
tell	Perceive (the difference between one person or thing and another). <i>He could tell that she was unhappy.</i>
utter	Express audibly utter sounds not necessarily words. <i>He uttered strange sounds that nobody could understand.</i>
verbalize	Convert into a verb. <i>They are unable to verbalize their real feelings.</i>

vocalize

Utter with vibrating vocal chords.
*The child **vocalizes** a number of distinct sounds.*
