*A thorough **dig** of the whole plot.*
- ersatz** (of a product) made or used as a substitute, typically an inferior one, for something else.  
***Ersatz** emotion.*

<b>excavate</b>	Remove earth carefully from (an area) in order to find buried remains. <i>The cheapest way of doing this was to <b>excavate</b> a long trench.</i>
<b>fabrication</b>	A deliberately false or improbable account. <i>The story was a complete <b>fabrication</b>.</i>
<b>fake</b>	Fraudulent; having a misleading appearance. <i>It isn't <b>fake</b> anything it's real synthetic fur.</i>
<b>faux</b>	Not genuine or real; being an imitation of the genuine article. <i>A <b>faux</b> fur jacket.</i>
<b>imitation</b>	The doctrine that representations of nature or human behavior should be accurate imitations. <i>A child learns to speak by <b>imitation</b>.</i>
<b>imitative</b>	Following a model or example without any attempt at originality. <i>Man is an <b>imitative</b> being.</i>
<b>inauthentic</b>	Not in fact what it is said to be. <i>These books were fabricated and contained <b>inauthentic</b> material.</i>
<b>jade</b>	Of something having the color of jade especially varying from bluish green to yellowish green. <i>A <b>jade</b> figurine.</i>
<b>mannequin</b>	A woman who wears clothes to display fashions. <i>She was too fat to be a <b>mannequin</b>.</i>
<b>model</b>	Construct a model of. <i><b>Model</b> a head with clay.</i>
<b>nephrite</b>	A hard, pale green or white mineral which is one of the forms of jade. It is a silicate of calcium and magnesium.
<b>nutritive</b>	Relating to nutrition. <i><b>Nutritive</b> food.</i>
<b>phony</b>	Fraudulent; having a misleading appearance.
<b>pit</b>	Remove the pits from. <i><b>Pit</b> plums and cherries.</i>
<b>preservative</b>	Tending or having the power to preserve. <i>The jams contain no artificial colours or <b>preservatives</b>.</i>
<b>priceless</b>	So precious that its value cannot be determined. <i><b>Priceless</b> works of art.</i>
<b>pseudo</b>	Not genuine; spurious or sham. <i>We are talking about real journalists and not the <b>pseudo</b> kind.</i>
<b>reproducible</b>	Able to be reproduced or copied. <i>The logo should be easily <b>reproducible</b>.</i>

<b>shard</b>	A piece of broken ceramic, metal, glass, or rock, typically having sharp edges. <i><b>Shards</b> of glass flew in all directions.</i>
<b>simulate</b>	Imitate the appearance or character of. <i>Future population changes were <b>simulated</b> by computer.</i>
<b>simulated</b>	Not genuine or real; being an imitation of the genuine article. <i>A <b>simulated</b> leather handbag.</i>
<b>spurious</b>	Not being what it purports to be; false or fake. <i>Separating authentic and <b>spurious</b> claims.</i>
<b>sweetener</b>	An inducement, typically in the form of money or a concession. <i>Diet drinks contain artificial <b>sweeteners</b> like saccharin.</i>
<b>synthetic</b>	A synthetic material or chemical especially a textile fibre. <i>All men are arrogant is a <b>synthetic</b> proposition.</i>
<b><u>unearth</u></b>	Discover (something hidden, lost, or kept secret) by investigation or searching. <i>They have done all they can to <b>unearth</b> the truth.</i>
