Definitions of "Artisan" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “artisan” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A worker in a skilled trade, especially one that involves making things by hand.*
- *(of food or drink) made in a traditional or non-mechanized way using high-quality ingredients.*
- *A skilled worker who practices some trade or handicraft.*



Synonyms of "Artisan" as a noun (11 Words)

artificer	An enlisted man responsible for the upkeep of small arms and machine guns etc.
<u>craftsman</u>	(in the UK) a qualified private soldier in the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers. <i>As an actor he was a consummate craftsman.</i>
craftsperson	A person who is skilled at making things by hand (used as a neutral alternative).
craftswoman	A female worker skilled in a particular craft. <i>The expert craftswoman teaches traditional building techniques.</i>
<u>journeyman</u>	A skilled worker who practices some trade or handicraft. <i>A journeyman carpenter.</i>
maker	A person who makes things. <i>A cabinetmaker.</i>
<u>mechanic</u>	A skilled worker who repairs and maintains vehicle engines and other machinery. <i>A car mechanic.</i>
operative	A worker, especially one in a manufacturing industry. <i>A CIA operative.</i>
smith	United States suffragist who refused to pay taxes until she could vote (1792-1886). <i>We do not know whether the metals were mined and smelted by the smith or purchased from miners.</i>
technician	Someone known for high skill in some intellectual or artistic technique. <i>A laboratory technician.</i>
wright	A maker or builder.



Usage Examples of "Artisan" as a noun

- *Britain's artisan cheeses.*
- *Street markets where local artisans display handwoven textiles, painted ceramics, and leather goods.*
- *The growing appreciation of artisan foods.*



Associations of "Artisan" (30 Words)

accomplished	Successfully completed or brought to an end. <i>A very elegant and accomplished person.</i>
adept	Very skilled or proficient at something. <i>Adept in handicrafts.</i>
adroit	Quick or skillful or adept in action or thought. <i>An adroit technician.</i>
competence	The ability to do something successfully or efficiently. <i>Courses to improve the competence of staff.</i>
competent	Properly or sufficiently qualified or capable or efficient. <i>The London Stock Exchange is the competent authority under the Financial Services Act.</i>
<u>craft</u>	An aircraft or spaceship. <i>The craft of cobbling.</i>

<u>craftsman</u>	A skilled worker who practices some trade or handicraft. <i>As an actor he was a consummate craftsman.</i>
craftsmanship	Skill in an occupation or trade. <i>I admire his engineering skills and craftsmanship.</i>
<u>deft</u>	Neatly skilful and quick in one's movements. <i>The script was both deft and literate.</i>
dexterous	Showing or having skill, especially with the hands. <i>A dexterous keyboard player.</i>
dextrous	Skillful in physical movements; especially of the hands.
expert	A person with special knowledge or ability who performs skillfully. <i>He had received expert academic advice.</i>
handcraft	Make something by hand. <i>She has been handcrafting furniture for decades.</i>
handmade	Made by hand, not by machine, and typically therefore of superior quality. <i>Delicate handmade baby dresses.</i>
mason	A Freemason. <i>The chief mason at Westminster Abbey.</i>
master	Make a master copy of a film or recording. <i>He acceded to his master's wishes.</i>
practiced	Having or showing knowledge and skill and aptitude. <i>A practiced marksman.</i>
proficiency	A high degree of skill; expertise. <i>He demonstrated his proficiency in Chinese.</i>
proficient	A person who is proficient. <i>I was proficient at my job.</i>
<u>seasoned</u>	Aged or processed. <i>Seasoned flour.</i>
skill	The ability to do something well; expertise. <i>The skills of cookery.</i>
skilled	(of work) requiring special abilities or training. <i>Skilled draughtsmen.</i>
skillful	Having or showing knowledge and skill and aptitude. <i>The effect was achieved by skillful retouching.</i>
tanner	A person who is employed to tan animal hides. <i>Skincare companies are coming to the rescue of consumers with sunless tanners.</i>

technique	A way of carrying out a particular task, especially the execution or performance of an artistic work or a scientific procedure. <i>He has excellent technique.</i>
toolmaker	Someone skilled in making or repairing tools.
<u>veteran</u>	A serviceman who has seen considerable active service. <i>A Vietnam veteran.</i>
weaver	A person who weaves fabric.
	Worthy of a good workman.
workmanlike	<i>The book is a workmanlike job with chronology and bibliography and index.</i>
workmanship	Skill in an occupation or trade. <i>Cracks on the motorway were caused by poor workmanship.</i>
