<a href="#">actual</a>	Being or existing at the present moment. <i><b>Actual</b> heroism.</i>
<a href="#">actuality</a>	The state of actually existing objectively. <i>A hope that progressed from possibility to <b>actuality</b>.</i>
<b>actually</b>	As the truth or facts of a situation; really. <i>He <b>actually</b> expected me to be pleased about it.</i>
<b>candidly</b>	In an honest and straightforward way; frankly. <i>He <b>candidly</b> discussed his efforts to find employment.</i>
<a href="#">certainty</a>	A fact that is definitely true or an event that is definitely going to take place. <i>He was expected to be a <b>certainty</b> for a gold medal.</i>
<b>diction</b>	The choice and use of words and phrases in speech or writing. <i>Wordsworth campaigned against exaggerated poetic <b>diction</b>.</i>
<a href="#">equally</a>	In the same manner or to the same extent. <i>They were <b>equally</b> beautiful.</i>
<a href="#">evenly</a>	So as to present a flat or uniform surface or line. <i>The match was <b>evenly</b> balanced throughout the first half.</i>
<a href="#">exact</a>	Inflict (revenge) on someone. <i>Hit the <b>exact</b> center of the target.</i>
<b>fair</b>	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>Looks like it s <b>fairing</b> off some.</i>
<a href="#">frankly</a>	It is sincerely the case that (used as intensives reflecting the speaker’s attitude). <i>She talks very <b>frankly</b> about herself.</i>
<b>genuinely</b>	Genuinely with authority. <i>Both parties <b>genuinely</b> believe they re right.</i>

<b><u>honestly</u></b>	It is sincerely the case that used as intensives reflecting the speaker's attitude honestly adv in an honest manner. <i>In he can't get it <b>honestly</b> he is willing to steal it.</i>
<b><u>indeed</u></b>	Used in a response to express interest, surprise, or contempt. <i>It was not expected to last long and <b>indeed</b> it took less than three weeks.</i>
<b>indistinguishable</b>	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>A colorless person quite <b>indistinguishable</b> from the colorless mass of humanity.</i>
<b>integrity</b>	An undivided or unbroken completeness or totality with nothing wanting. <i><b>Integrity</b> checking.</i>
<b>knowable</b>	Able to be observed, understood, or ascertained. <i>The full extent of the damage isn't <b>knowable</b> in advance.</i>
<b>like</b>	Prefer or wish to do something. <i>I know him him and his <b>like</b>.</i>
<b>literal</b>	A mistake in printed matter resulting from mechanical failures of some kind. <i>A <b>literal</b> solitude like a desert.</i>
<b><u>possible</u></b>	The highest possible score especially in a shooting competition. <i>Mickey scored the <b>possible</b>.</i>
<b><u>qualitative</u></b>	Of high quality; excellent. <i><b>Qualitative</b> change.</i>
<b>real</b>	Coinciding with reality. <i>Locke's distinction between the <b>real</b> and nominal essence of substances.</i>
<b>reality</b>	Relating to reality TV. <i>He refuses to face <b>reality</b>.</i>
<b>related</b>	Being connected either logically or causally or by shared characteristics. <i>Income <b>related</b> benefits.</i>
<b>revealing</b>	(of an item of clothing) allowing more of the wearer's body to be seen than is usual. <i>A <b>revealing</b> radio interview.</i>
<b>rightness</b>	According with conscience or morality. <i>The <b>rightness</b> of that move for me.</i>

<b>truth</b>	Conformity to reality or actuality. <i>He thought of answering with the <b>truth</b> but he knew they wouldn't believe it.</i>
<u><a href="#">veracity</a></u>	Habitual truthfulness. <i>Voters should be concerned about his <b>veracity</b> and character.</i>
<u><a href="#">virtual</a></u>	Existing in essence or effect though not in actual fact. <i><b>Virtual</b> learning.</i>
<b>wording</b>	The words used to express something; the way in which something is expressed. <i>The standard form of <b>wording</b> for a consent letter.</i>
