## Associations of "As if" (30 Words)

<b>alike</b>	In a like manner. <i>He talked in a friendly manner to staff and patients <b>alike</b>.</i>
<b><u>commensurate</u></b>	Corresponding in size or degree or extent. <i>Pay should be <b>commensurate</b> with the time worked.</i>
<b><u>comparable</u></b>	Able to be likened to another; similar. <i>The situation in Holland is <b>comparable</b> to that in England.</i>
<b><u>congruent</u></b>	(of figures) identical in form; coinciding exactly when superimposed. <i>The rules may not be <b>congruent</b> with the requirements of the law.</i>
<b>congruous</b>	In agreement or harmony. <i>This explanation is <b>congruous</b> with earlier observations.</i>
<b><u>ditto</u></b>	The same thing again used in lists and accounts and often indicated by a ditto mark under the word or figure to be repeated. <i>If one folds his arms so does the other if one crosses his legs <b>ditto</b>.</i>
<b>equal</b>	Be equal to in quality or ability. <i>Four plus six divided by two <b>equals</b> five.</i>
<b><u>equalize</u></b>	Compensate; make the score equal. <i>Morgan <b>equalized</b> ten minutes into the second half.</i>
<b><u>equally</u></b>	In equal amounts or shares; in a balanced or impartial way. <i>They were <b>equally</b> beautiful.</i>
<b>equivalent</b>	The atomic weight of an element that has the same combining capacity as a given weight of another element; the standard is 8 for oxygen. <i>The French <b>equivalent</b> of the Bank of England.</i>
<b>evenhanded</b>	Without partiality. <i><b>Evenhanded</b> justice.</i>
<b><u>evenly</u></b>	In a level and regular way. <i>Signals are numbered <b>evenly</b> 2 4 6 8 etc.</i>

<b>fair</b>	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>Deal <b>fairly</b> with one another.</i>
<b>identical</b>	(of something encountered on separate occasions) the same. <i>The passage on the second floor was <b>identical</b> to the one below.</i> Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated.
<b>indistinguishable</b>	<i>A colorless person quite <b>indistinguishable</b> from the colorless mass of humanity.</i>
<b>isochronous</b>	Occupying equal time.
<b>just</b>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>I <b>just</b> can't take it anymore.</i>
<b>justice</b>	A public official authorized to decide questions brought before a court of justice. <i>A concern for <b>justice</b> peace and genuine respect for people.</i>
<b>like</b>	A kind of person. <i>I know him him and his <b>like</b>.</i>
<b>liken</b>	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is <b>likened</b> to a contagious disease.</i>
<b>par</b>	A par score at a hole. <i>A <b>par</b> 5 hole.</i>
<b>proportionate</b>	Agreeing in amount, magnitude, or degree. <i><b>Proportionate</b> representation of a minority group.</i>
<b>same</b>	Same in identity. <i>She was saying the <b>same</b> thing over and over.</i>
<b>similar</b>	A person or thing similar to another. <i>He was one of those whose <b>similar</b> you never meet.</i>
<b>similitude</b>	Similarity in appearance or character or nature between persons or things. <i>There is a striking <b>similitude</b> between the brother and sister.</i>
<b>symmetrical</b>	Exhibiting equivalence or correspondence among constituents of an entity or between different entities. <i>The shape of a hill smooth and <b>symmetrical</b>.</i>
<b>synonymous</b>	(of a word or phrase) having the same meaning as another word or phrase in the same language. <i>His deeds had made his name <b>synonymous</b> with victory.</i>
<b>tantamount</b>	Being essentially equal to something. <i>The resignations were <b>tantamount</b> to an admission of guilt.</i>
