Associations of "As opposed to" (30 Words)

adverse	Contrary to your interests or welfare. <i>Adverse weather conditions.</i>
antithetic	Sharply contrasted in character or purpose. <i>Hope is antithetic to despair.</i>
antithetical	Directly opposed or contrasted; mutually incompatible. <i>Practices entirely antithetical to her professed beliefs.</i>
assail	Criticize strongly. <i>Nightmares assailed him regularly.</i>
comparable	Conforming in every respect. <i>Nobody is comparable with this athlete.</i>
comparison	Qualities that are comparable. <i>Perhaps the best comparison is that of seasickness.</i>
competitor	The contestant you hope to defeat. <i>Our main industrial competitors.</i>
counterpart	A person or thing having the same function or characteristics as another. <i>The minister held talks with his French counterpart.</i>
diametrical	Of or along a diameter. <i>He s the diametrical opposite of Gabriel.</i>
ditto	The same thing again used in lists and accounts and often indicated by a ditto mark under the word or figure to be repeated. <i>If one folds his arms so does the other if one crosses his legs ditto.</i>
enemy	A personal enemy. <i>Routine is the enemy of art.</i>
equally	In the same manner or to the same extent. <i>Follow up discussion is equally important.</i>

equivalent	The mass of a particular substance that can combine with or displace one gram of hydrogen or eight grams of oxygen, used in expressing combining powers, especially of elements. <i>The French equivalent of the Bank of England.</i>
evenhanded	Without partiality. <i>Evenhanded justice.</i>
<u>evenly</u>	In a level and regular way. <i>Scoop cream on to the cake and spread evenly.</i>
<u>fiercely</u>	In a powerful and destructive manner. <i>The wind was blowing fiercely.</i>
foe	A personal enemy. <i>His work was praised by friends and foes alike.</i>
<u>identical</u>	Similar in every detail; exactly alike. <i>She stole a suitcase from the identical station at which she had been arrested before.</i>
indistinguishable	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>The two specimens are actually different from each other but the differences are almost indistinguishable.</i>
like	Want to have. <i>We ll not see his like again.</i>
liken	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is likened to a contagious disease.</i>
literal	Absolute (used to emphasize that a strong expression is deliberately chosen to convey one's feelings). <i>Dreadful in its literal sense full of dread.</i>
opponent	A person who disagrees with or resists a proposal or practice. <i>The news will delight opponents of GM foods.</i>
<u>parallel</u>	Be parallel to. <i>A challenge which has no parallel in peacetime this century.</i>
<u>possible</u>	The highest possible score especially in a shooting competition. <i>The team have taken just three points from a possible twelve.</i>
rival	Be the rival of be in competition with. <i>Gun battles between rival gangs.</i>
similar	A person or thing similar to another. <i>A soft cheese similar to Brie.</i>
<u>tantamount</u>	Being essentially equal to something. <i>His statement was tantamount to an admission of guilt.</i>
