Associations of "As such" (30 Words)

alike	Used to show that something applies equally to a number of specified subjects. <i>The houses all looked alike.</i>
<u>commensurate</u>	Corresponding in size or degree or extent. <i>Salary will be commensurate with age and experience.</i>
<u>comparable</u>	Able to be compared or worthy of comparison. <i>The situation in Holland is comparable to that in England.</i>
<u>congruent</u>	Corresponding in character or kind. <i>The rules may not be congruent with the requirements of the law.</i>
congruous	Corresponding in character or kind. <i>This explanation is congruous with earlier observations.</i>
<u>ditto</u>	The same thing again used in lists and accounts and often indicated by a ditto mark under the word or figure to be repeated. <i>The next speaker dittoed her argument.</i>
equal	A person who is of equal standing with another in a group. <i>He equalled the world record of 9 93 seconds.</i>
<u>equalize</u>	Make equal, uniform, corresponding, or matching. <i>Let s equalize the duties among all employees in this office.</i>
<u>equally</u>	In amounts or parts that are the same in size. <i>Not all who live in inner cities are poor equally many poor people live outside inner cities.</i>
equivalent	Belonging to the same equivalence class. <i>The French equivalent of the Bank of England.</i>
evenhanded	Without partiality. <i>Evenhanded justice.</i>
<u>evenly</u>	So as to present a flat or uniform surface or line. <i>He speaks evenly and softly.</i>

fair	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>World fair.</i>
identical	Expressing an identity. <i>She stole a suitcase from the identical station at which she had been arrested before.</i>
indistinguishable	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>The counterfeit bills were virtually indistinguishable from the real thing.</i>
isochronous	Equal in duration or interval.
just	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>A just and democratic society.</i>
justice	A public official authorized to decide questions brought before a court of justice. <i>A tragic miscarriage of justice.</i>
like	Used in speech as a meaningless filler or to signify the speaker's uncertainty about an expression just used. <i>Doglike devotion.</i>
liken	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is likened to a contagious disease.</i>
par	A par score at a hole. <i>On a par with the best.</i>
proportionate	Being in due proportion. <i>Proportionate representation of a minority group.</i>
same	Same in identity. <i>Animals of the same species.</i>
similar	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>The principle of treatment by similars.</i>
similitude	The quality or state of being similar to something. <i>Conrad uses a range of constructions which express or imply similitude.</i>
symmetrical	Made up of exactly similar parts facing each other or around an axis; showing symmetry. <i>The shape of a hill smooth and symmetrical.</i>
synonymous	Meaning the same or nearly the same. <i>His deeds had made his name synonymous with victory.</i>
tantamount	Equivalent in seriousness to; virtually the same as. <i>His statement was tantamount to an admission of guilt.</i>
