- A movement upward.
- (New Testament) the rising of the body of Jesus into heaven on the 40th day after his Resurrection.



rebirthThe revival of learning and culture.

reincarnation The rebirth of a soul in another body.

He believed he was the **reincarnation** of Louis XVI.

resurrect Restore (a dead person) to life.

He queried whether Jesus was indeed **resurrect**ed.

The revitalization or revival of something.

The **resurrection** of the country under a charismatic leader.

resuscitated Restored to life or consciousness.

revive Regain life, consciousness, or strength.

Many pagan traditions are being **revive**d.

A secular form of gospel that was a major Black musical genre in the

soul 1960s and 1970s.

Their interpretation lacked **soul**.
