- With an attitude or look of suspicion or disapproval.
- With suspicion or disapproval.

Synonyms of "Askance" as an adverb (7 Words)

In a way that expresses doubt as to whether something will happen or

cynically whether it is worthwhile.

He was accused of **cynically** exploiting a terrible tragedy.

... With distrust.

distrustfully She looked at him distrustfully.

doubtfully In a doubtful manner.

Gerald shook his head **doubtfully**.

dubiously In a doubtful manner.

He **dubiously** claimed that he was a self made man.

mistrustfully With distrust.

sceptically With scepticism; in a sceptical manner.

He looked at her **sceptically**.

suspiciously With suspicion.

The group was **suspiciously** quiet about their activities.

Usage Examples of "Askance" as an adverb

- The reformers looked askance at the mystical tradition.
- A waiter looked askance at his jeans.

debatable Open to discussion or argument.

doubt Consider unlikely or have doubts about.

I **doubt** not any ones contradicting this Journal.

doubtful Fraught with uncertainty or doubt. The candidate s **doubtful** past.

downside A negative aspect of something that is generally positive.

There is a **downside** even to motherhood.

dubious Not convinced.

I was rather **dubious** about the whole idea.

eye The region of the face surrounding the eyes.

Margot saw the women **eye**ing up her boyfriend.

fixate Attach (oneself) to a person or thing in a neurotic way.

He became **fixate**d on the idea of a Third World War.

A long fixed look.

questioning Showing an interest in learning new things.

This situation should prompt **questioning**.

shady Giving shade from sunlight.

sidelong Inclining or directed to one side – Bram Stoker.

Steve gave her a **sidelong** glance.

sideways From the side; obliquely.

After the reshuffle there were **sideways** moves for ministers.

Denying or questioning the tenets of especially a religion.

A **skeptical** listener.

The act of squinting looking with the eyes partly closed.

The **squint** bottom edge of the puzzle.

A fixed look with eyes open wide.

She tried hard not to **stare**.

Staring Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers.

Stark **staring** mad.

Doubt the genuineness or truth of.

The police have arrested a **suspect**.
