lopsided Having one side lower or smaller or lighter than the other.

A **lopsided** grin.

**oblique** (of a line, plane figure, or surface) inclined at other than a right angle.

He issued an **oblique** attack on the President.

Neither parallel nor at right angles to a specified or implied line askew

**skew** crooked.

A **skew** angle.

**skew-whiff** Turned or twisted toward one side- G.K.Chesterton. **skewed** Having an oblique or slanting direction or position.

**slanted**Having an oblique or slanted direction.

The highly **slanted** report of the murders.

**tilted**Departing or being caused to depart from the true vertical or horizontal.

The headstones were **tilted**.

Not level or smooth.

The floors are cracked and **uneven**.

unsymmetrical Having unsymmetrical parts or unequal dimensions or measurements.

wonky Inclined to shake as from weakness or defect.

The bridge still stands though one of the arches is **wonky**.

There was something **amiss** about his calculations.

With a side or oblique glance. askance

A waiter looked **askance** at his jeans.

Characterized by asymmetry in the spatial arrangement or placement of asymmetric

parts or components.

**asymmetrical** Irregular in shape or outline. *Asymmetrical features.* 

Away from the usual or expected course; amiss.

<u>awry</u> Many youthful romances go awry.



crooked Having or marked by bends or angles; not straight or aligned.

A crooked business deal.

Believing the worst of human nature and motives; having a sneering

**cynical** disbelief in e.g. selflessness of others.

Her cynical attitude.

doubtful Fraught with uncertainty or doubt.

I was **doubtful** of my judgement.

Open to doubt or suspicion.

They admitted the force of my argument but remained **dubious**.

**gnarled** Used of old persons or old trees; covered with knobs or knots.

The **gnarled** old oak tree.

imperfectly In a flawed or incomplete way.

The disease was **imperfectly** understood at the time.

A member of an irregular armed force that fights a stronger force by

<u>irregular</u> sabotage and harassment.

Irregular hiring practices.

**knotty** Tangled in knots or snarls.

A **knotty** problem.

Openly distrustful and unwilling to confide.

A city **leery** of gang violence.

lopsided Having one side lower or smaller or lighter than the other.

A **lopsided** grin.

oblique An oblique muscle.

The **oblique** rays of the winter sun.

guestionable Subject to question.

A fire of **questionable** origin.

refractive Of or involving refraction.

The **refractive** characteristics of the eye.

sceptical Relating to the theory that certain knowledge is impossible.

The public were deeply **sceptical** about some of the proposals.

Move or lie in a winding path or line.

serpentine Serpentine coils.

To or from one side; sideways.

Shot out **sidelong** boughs.

Directed or moving to, towards, or from the side.

**sideways** He rambled through a number of subjects before making a **sideways** 

approach to what he really wanted.



Denying or questioning the tenets of especially a religion.

A **skeptical** listener.

squint

The act of squinting looking with the eyes partly closed.

Her left eye **squint**ed slightly.

The path **twist**ed through the forest.

**unequal** A person or thing regarded as unequal to another in status or level.

Two rooms of **unequal** size.

Variable and recurring at irregular intervals.

The **uneven** distribution of resources.

winding The act of winding or twisting.

Our bedroom was at the top of a **winding** staircase.
