## Asphalt as a Noun

### Definitions of "Asphalt" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “asphalt” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Mixed asphalt and crushed gravel or sand; used especially for paving but also for roofing.*
- *The pitch used in asphalt, sometimes found in natural deposits but usually made by the distillation of crude oil.*
- *A mixture of dark bituminous pitch with sand or gravel, used for surfacing roads, flooring, roofing, etc.*
- *A dark bituminous substance found in natural beds and as residue from petroleum distillation; consists mainly of hydrocarbons.*



### Synonyms of "Asphalt" as a noun (3 Words)

- bitumen** Any of various naturally occurring impure mixtures of hydrocarbons.  
*A kilometre and a half of **bitumen**.*
- mineral pitch** Solid homogeneous inorganic substances occurring in nature having a definite chemical composition.
- tar** A substance resembling tar formed by burning tobacco or other material.  
*High **tar** cigarettes.*

## Synonyms of "Asphalt" as a verb (12 Words)

<a href="#"><u>concrete</u></a>	Make real or concrete instead of abstract. <i>The post is <b>concreted</b> into the ground.</i>
<b>concrete over</b>	Form into a solid mass; coalesce.
<b>cover</b>	Provide with a covering or cause to be covered. <i>She was <b>covered</b> in confusion.</i>
<b>finish</b>	Come or bring to a finish or an end. <i>Dean <b>finished</b> well to put his team ahead.</i>
<a href="#"><u>flag</u></a>	Register a vessel in a particular country under whose flag it then sails. <i>The disease was <b>flagged</b> up as a priority area for research.</i>
<a href="#"><u>floor</u></a>	Provide a room or area with a floor. <i>That question <b>floored</b> him.</i>
<a href="#"><u>metal</u></a>	Make or mend a road with road metal. <i>Several miles of the old road had been <b>metalled</b> with crushed stone.</i>

<b>surface</b>	Rise or come up to the surface of the water or the ground. <i>I hope the list key is going to <b>surface</b> again.</i>
<b>tar</b>	Cover something with tar. <i><b>Tar</b> the roof.</i>
<b>tarmac</b>	Surface a road or other outdoor area with tarmac or a similar material. <i>They ll be wanting to <b>tarmac</b> the path.</i>
<b>tile</b>	Cover with tiles. <i>The lobby was <b>tiled</b> in blue.</i>
<b>top</b>	Be at the top of or constitute the top or highest point. <i>Sliced and <b>topped</b> shots.</i>

## Associations of "Asphalt" (30 Words)

### avenue

A way of approaching a problem or making progress towards something.  
An **avenue** of limes.

### **boulevard**

A wide street in a town or city, typically one lined with trees.  
Sunset **Boulevard**.

### bridge

The central part of a pair of glasses fitting over the bridge of the nose.  
Her glasses left marks on the **bridge** of her nose.

### cement

Bind or join with or as if with cement.  
We **cemented** our friendship.

### concrete

Make real or concrete instead of abstract.  
**Concrete** objects like stones.

### **crossing**

The action of crossing something.  
The **crossing** of the Pennines.

<b><u>crossover</u></b>	The process of achieving success in a different field or style, especially in popular music. A <b>crossover</b> study.
<b>crossroad</b>	A junction where one street or road crosses another.
<b>crosswalk</b>	A marked part of a road where pedestrians have right of way to cross; a pedestrian crossing.
<b>drawbridge</b>	A bridge that can be raised to block passage or to allow boats or ships to pass beneath it. <i>There was a rattle of chains as the <b>drawbridge</b> was lowered.</i>
<b>driveway</b>	A road leading up to a private house. <i>One of the suspects backed a vehicle into the <b>driveway</b>.</i>
<b>fordable</b>	Shallow enough to be crossed by walking or riding on an animal or in a vehicle. <i>The stream was <b>fordable</b>.</i>
<b>highway</b>	(chiefly in official use) a public road. <i>The <b>highway</b> to success.</i>
<b><u>intersection</u></b>	A representation of common ground between theories or phenomena. <i>The set of red hats is the <b>intersection</b> of the set of hats and the set of red things.</i>
<b>junction</b>	A point where two or more things are joined. <i>The <b>junction</b> of Queen s Road and Lancaster Avenue.</i>
<b>lamppost</b>	A metal post supporting an outdoor lamp (such as a streetlight).
<b>lane</b>	A route prescribed for or regularly followed by ships or aircraft. <i>The car moved into the outside <b>lane</b>.</i>
<b>masonry</b>	Freemasonry. <b>Masonry</b> nails.
<b>path</b>	A course of conduct. <i>A vegetarian diet could be the <b>path</b> to a longer life.</i>
<b>pave</b>	A setting with precious stones so closely set that no metal shows. <b>Pave</b> the roads in the village.
<b>pavement</b>	Material used to pave an area. A <b>pavement</b> cafe.
<b><u>pedestrian</u></b>	A person who travels by foot. <i>The road is so dangerous <b>pedestrians</b> avoid it.</i>
<b><u>road</u></b>	The part of a road intended for vehicles especially in contrast to a verge or pavement. <i>They waited for a clear <b>road</b> at Hellifield Junction.</i>



<b>roadway</b>	A road (especially that part of a road) over which vehicles travel.
<b>route</b>	Send via a specific route. <i>The scenic <b>route</b> from Florence to Siena.</i>
<b>sidewalk</b>	A paved path for pedestrians at the side of a road; a pavement.
<b>skyway</b>	A covered overhead walkway between buildings. <i><b>Skyways</b> from 18 000 to 40 000 feet resemble a highway system.</i>
<a href="#"><u>street</u></a>	The streets of a city viewed as a depressed environment in which there is poverty and crime and prostitution and dereliction. <i>The <b>street</b> kids of the city.</i>
<b>tarmac</b>	A runway or other area surfaced with tarmac or a similar material. <i>The <b>tarmac</b> path.</i>
<a href="#"><u>walkway</u></a>	A passage or path for walking along, especially a raised passageway connecting different sections of a building or a wide path in a park or garden.
