
Aspiration as a Noun

- The action of drawing fluid by suction from a vessel or cavity.
- A manner of articulation involving an audible release of breath.
- The act of inhaling; the drawing in of air (or other gases) as in breathing.
- A will to succeed.
- The action or process of drawing breath.
- A cherished desire.

Miranda felt a wistful **longing** for the old days.


urge A strong restless desire.
