Associations of "Aspirational" (30 Words)

aim	Move into a desired direction of discourse. <i>The programme will aim at deepening understanding.</i>
ambition	Have as one's ambition. <i>His ambition is to own his own business.</i>
aspire	Direct one's hopes or ambitions towards achieving something. <i>We never thought that we might aspire to those heights.</i>
covet	Yearn to possess (something, especially something belonging to another). <i>She covets her sister's house.</i>
crave	Feel a powerful desire for (something). <i>Will craved for family life.</i>
craving	An intense desire for some particular thing. <i>A craving for chocolate.</i>
desideratum	Something desired as a necessity. <i>Integrity was a desideratum.</i>
desire	Feel or have a desire for want strongly. <i>He never achieved the status he so desired.</i>
desperation	Desperate recklessness. <i>Courage born of desperation.</i>
dream	Have a daydream indulge in a fantasy. <i>He dreamt a strange scene.</i>
eagerly	In a keenly expectant or interested manner. <i>Fans of the show are eagerly awaiting the new season.</i>
hankering	A strong desire to have or do something. <i>A hankering for family life.</i>
heading	A division of a subject; a class or category. <i>Chapter headings.</i>

homesick	Experiencing a longing for one's home during a period of absence from it. <i>He was homesick for America after five weeks in Europe.</i>
homesickness	A feeling of longing for one's home during a period of absence from it. <i>I lived four years in London without a single pang of homesickness.</i>
inspiration	An act of breathing in; an inhalation. <i>Then I had an inspiration.</i>
<u>intention</u>	(usually plural) the goal with respect to a marriage proposal. <i>Good intentions are not enough.</i>
<u>longing</u>	A yearning desire. <i>Miranda felt a wistful longing for the old days.</i>
objective	The objective case. <i>There is no objective evidence of anything of the kind.</i>
<u>opportunist</u>	Opportunistic. <i>Most burglaries are committed by casual opportunists.</i>
<u>purport</u>	The pervading meaning or tenor. <i>I do not understand the purport of your remarks.</i>
purpose	The quality of being determined to do or achieve something firmness of purpose. <i>The purpose of the meeting is to appoint a trustee.</i>
purposive	Having or showing or acting with a purpose or design. <i>Teaching is a purposive activity.</i>
<u>unquenchable</u>	Impossible to quench. <i>Unquenchable thirst.</i>
<u>unrequited</u>	Not returned in kind. <i>He s been pining with unrequited love.</i>
want	Hunt or look for want for a particular reason. <i>I tried to supply his wants.</i>
weariness	Extreme tiredness; fatigue. <i>Weariness overcame her after twelve hours and she fell asleep.</i>
wishing	A specific feeling of desire. <i>He was above all wishing and desire.</i>
<u>yearn</u>	Desire strongly or persistently. <i>They yearned to go home.</i>
yearning	Involving or expressing yearning. <i>A yearning hope.</i>
