<a href="#">aim</a>	Point or cause to go (blows, weapons, or objects such as photographic equipment) towards. <i>I <b>aim</b> to arrive at noon.</i>
<b>aim for</b>	Propose or intend.
<b>aim to</b>	Move into a desired direction of discourse.
<b>desire</b>	Express a desire for. <i>He never achieved the status he so <b>desired</b>.</i>
<b>desire to</b>	Feel or have a desire for; want strongly.
<b>draw a bead on</b>	Take in, also metaphorically.
<b>dream of</b>	Have a daydream; indulge in a fantasy.
<a href="#">expect</a>	Consider obligatory request and expect. <i>We <b>expect</b> great things of you.</i>
<b>expect to</b>	Be pregnant with.
<b>hanker after</b>	Desire strongly or persistently.
<b>hanker for</b>	Desire strongly or persistently.
<b>hanker to</b>	Desire strongly or persistently.

<b>have as one's aim</b>	Achieve a point or goal.
<b>have as one's goal</b>	Have left.
<b>have the objective of</b>	Suffer from; be ill with.
<b>hope for</b>	Intend with some possibility of fulfilment.
<b>hope to</b>	Be optimistic; be full of hope; have hopes.
<b>hunger for</b>	Feel the need to eat.
<b>hunger to</b>	Have a craving, appetite, or great desire for.
<b>long for</b>	Desire strongly or persistently.
<b>long to</b>	Desire strongly or persistently.
<b><u>pursue</u></b>	Continue or proceed along (a path or route). <i>Andrew was determined to <b>pursue</b> a computer career.</i>
<b>seek</b>	Inquire for. <b>Seek</b> an education.
<b>seek to</b>	Make an effort or attempt.
<b>set one's heart on</b>	Put into a position that will restore a normal state.
<b>set one's sights on</b>	Set in type.
<b>shoot for</b>	Throw or propel in a specific direction or towards a specific objective.
<b>want</b>	Hunt or look for want for a particular reason. <i>He is <b>wanted</b> by the police in connection with an arms theft.</i>
<b>want to</b>	Feel or have a desire for; want strongly.
<b>wish for</b>	Order politely express a wish for.
<b>wish to</b>	Prefer or wish to do something.
<b>yearn for</b>	Have affection for; feel tenderness for.
<b>yearn to</b>	Desire strongly or persistently.



## Usage Examples of "Aspire" as a verb

- *Above the domes of loftiest mosques these pinnacles aspire.*
- *Other people will aspire to be like you.*
- *We never thought that we might aspire to those heights.*

- ambition** Have as one's ambition.  
*Her **ambition** was to become a pilot.*
- aspiration** The action of pronouncing a sound with an exhalation of breath.  
*The yawning gulf between **aspiration** and reality.*
- beg** Acquire food or money from someone by begging.  
*He **begged** their forgiveness.*
- bygone** A thing dating from an earlier time.  
*Relics of a **bygone** age.*
- covet** Yearn to possess (something, especially something belonging to another).  
*She **covets** her sister's house.*
- covetous** Having or showing a great desire to possess something belonging to someone else.  
*Jealous of his success and **covetous** of his possessions.*

<b><u>crave</u></b>	Ask for. <i>I must <b>crave</b> your indulgence.</i>
<b><u>craving</u></b>	A powerful desire for something. <i>A <b>craving</b> for chocolate.</i>
<b>desideratum</b>	Something desired as a necessity. <i>Integrity was a <b>desideratum</b>.</i>
<b>desire</b>	Express a desire for. <i>There had been a time years ago when he had <b>desired</b> her.</i>
<b><u>desperation</u></b>	A state of despair, typically one which results in rash or extreme behaviour. <i>Courage born of <b>desperation</b>.</i>
<b><u>eagerly</u></b>	With eagerness; in an eager manner. <i>Fans of the show are <b>eagerly</b> awaiting the new season.</i>
<b><u>envious</u></b>	Feeling or showing envy. <i>An <b>envious</b> glance.</i>
<b>hanker</b>	Desire strongly or persistently. <i>She <b>hankered</b> to go back.</i>
<b>hankering</b>	A strong desire to have or do something. <i>A <b>hankering</b> for family life.</i>
<b>homesick</b>	Experiencing a longing for one's home during a period of absence from it. <i>He was <b>homesick</b> for America after five weeks in Europe.</i>
<b>homesickness</b>	A longing to return home. <i>I lived four years in London without a single pang of <b>homesickness</b>.</i>
<b><u>insatiable</u></b>	Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something especially sex. <i>An <b>insatiable</b> hunger for success.</i>
<b><u>jealous</u></b>	Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages. <i>She was always <b>jealous</b> of me.</i>
<b><u>long</u></b>	Of elongated shape. <i>A <b>long</b> position in gold.</i>
<b><u>longing</u></b>	A yearning desire. <i>Miranda felt a wistful <b>longing</b> for the old days.</i>
<b><u>nostalgia</u></b>	Something done or presented in order to evoke feelings of nostalgia. <i>An evening of TV <b>nostalgia</b>.</i>
<b><u>starve</u></b>	Die of food deprivation. <i>The political prisoners <b>starved</b> to death.</i>

<b>thirst</b>	Have a strong desire for something. <i>His <b>thirst</b> for knowledge was mainly academic.</i>
<b><u>unquenchable</u></b>	Not able to be quenched. <i>His enthusiasm was <b>unquenchable</b>.</i>
<b><u>unrequited</u></b>	Not returned in kind. <i><b>Unrequited</b> unanswered love.</i>
<b>want</b>	Feel or have a desire for want strongly. <i>She <b>wanted</b> me to leave.</i>
<b>weariness</b>	Reluctance to see or experience any more of something. <i>He began to feel <b>weariness</b>.</i>
<b><u>yearn</u></b>	Have an intense feeling of longing for something, typically something that one has lost or been separated from. <i>No fellow spirit <b>yearned</b> towards her.</i>
<b>yearning</b>	Involving or expressing yearning. <i>A <b>yearning</b> hope.</i>
