ambition	Have as one's ambition. <i>Young men and women with ambition.</i>
<u>aspiration</u>	A will to succeed. <i>The needs and aspirations of the people.</i>
<u>beg</u>	Acquire food or money from someone by begging. <i>Beg the question.</i>
bygone	Well in the past; former. <i>Let bygones be bygones.</i>
<u>covet</u>	Wish, long, or crave for (something, especially the property of another person). <i>She covets her sister's house.</i>
covetous	Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages. <i>Casting covetous eyes on his neighbor's fields.</i>
<u>crave</u>	Plead or ask for earnestly. <i>Will craved for family life.</i>
<u>craving</u>	A powerful desire for something. <i>A craving for chocolate.</i>
desideratum	Something that is needed or wanted. <i>Integrity was a desideratum.</i>
desire	Feel or have a desire for want strongly. <i>John spoke unto him and desired him in like manner and contestation as before.</i>
<u>desperation</u>	A state of despair, typically one which results in rash or extreme behaviour. <i>It was a policy of desperation.</i>
<u>eagerly</u>	Used to emphasize a strong desire to do or have something. <i>Fans of the show are eagerly awaiting the new season.</i>

<u>envious</u>	Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages. <i>Envious of their art collection.</i>
hanker	Desire strongly or persistently. <i>She hankered to go back.</i>
hankering	A strong desire to have or do something. <i>He had a hankering to return to Scotland.</i>
homesick	Experiencing a longing for one's home during a period of absence from it. <i>He was homesick for America after five weeks in Europe.</i>
homesickness	A feeling of longing for one's home during a period of absence from it. <i>I lived four years in London without a single pang of homesickness.</i>
<u>insatiable</u>	Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something especially sex. <i>So insatiable a gourmand as myself.</i>
<u>jealous</u>	Feeling or showing an envious resentment of someone or their achievements, possessions, or perceived advantages. <i>A jealous husband.</i>
<u>long</u>	For a long time. <i>Long ago.</i>
<u>longing</u>	A yearning desire. <i>Miranda felt a wistful longing for the old days.</i>
<u>nostalgia</u>	Something done or presented in order to evoke feelings of nostalgia. <i>An evening of TV nostalgia.</i>
<u>starve</u>	Have a craving, appetite, or great desire for. <i>Seven million starved to death.</i>
thirst	Feel the need to drink. <i>His thirst for knowledge was mainly academic.</i>
<u>unquenchable</u>	Not able to be quenched. <i>His enthusiasm was unquenchable.</i>
<u>unrequited</u>	Not returned in kind. <i>Unrequited unanswered love.</i>
want	Hunt or look for want for a particular reason. <i>Flood victims wanting food and shelter.</i>
weariness	Temporary loss of strength and energy resulting from hard physical or mental work. <i>Weariness overcame her after twelve hours and she fell asleep.</i>

yearn

Have an intense feeling of longing for something, typically something that one has lost or been separated from.

*No fellow spirit **yearned** towards her.*

yearning

Involving or expressing yearning.

*A **yearning** hope.*
