Have the intention of achieving.

*She wanted to **aim** a pun.*

draw a bead on

Thread on or as if on a string.

shoot for

Emit (as light, flame, or fumes) suddenly and forcefully.



Associations of "Aspires" (30 Words)

ambition	Have as one's ambition. <i>Her ambition was to become a pilot.</i>
<u>aspiration</u>	A cherished desire. <i>There is no aspiration if the syllable begins with s.</i>
<u>beg</u>	Acquire food or money from someone by begging. <i>I beg you to stop.</i>
bygone	Past events to be put aside. <i>Bygone days.</i>
<u>covet</u>	Yearn to possess (something, especially something belonging to another). <i>I covet one of their smart bags.</i>
covetous	Immoderately desirous of acquiring e.g. wealth. <i>He was never covetous before he met her.</i>
<u>crave</u>	Plead or ask for earnestly. <i>Will craved for family life.</i>
<u>craving</u>	An intense desire for some particular thing. <i>A craving for chocolate.</i>

desideratum	Something that is needed or wanted. <i>Integrity was a desideratum.</i>
desire	Something that is desired. <i>John spake unto him and desired him in like manner and contestation as before.</i>
desperation	A state in which all hope is lost or absent. <i>It was a policy of desperation.</i>
eagerly	With eagerness; in an eager manner. <i>The news was eagerly awaited.</i>
envious	Feeling or showing envy. <i>An envious glance.</i>
hanker	Feel a strong desire for or to do something. <i>She hankered to go back.</i>
hankering	A yearning for something or to do something. <i>He had a hankering to return to Scotland.</i>
homesick	Experiencing a longing for one's home during a period of absence from it. <i>He was homesick for America after five weeks in Europe.</i>
homesickness	A longing to return home. <i>I lived four years in London without a single pang of homesickness.</i>
insatiable	Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something especially sex. <i>So insatiable a gourmand as myself.</i>
jealous	Fiercely protective of one's rights or possessions. <i>A jealous husband.</i>
long	Long dated securities especially gilts. <i>Looked out the long French windows.</i>
longing	Prolonged unfulfilled desire or need. <i>Miranda felt a wistful longing for the old days.</i>
nostalgia	Something done or presented in order to evoke feelings of nostalgia. <i>An evening of TV nostalgia.</i>
starve	Deprive of a necessity and cause suffering. <i>The arts are being starved of funds.</i>
thirst	Feel the need to drink. <i>A few could drink while many thirsted.</i>
unquenchable	Not able to be quenched. <i>His enthusiasm was unquenchable.</i>

unrequited

Not returned in kind.

*He s been pining with **unrequited** love.*

want

Feel or have a desire for want strongly.

*You don t **want** to believe everything you hear.*

weariness

Extreme tiredness; fatigue.

*He began to feel **weariness**.*

yearn

Desire strongly or persistently.

*No fellow spirit **yearned** towards her.*

yearning

Involving or expressing yearning.

*A **yearning** hope.*
