
Aspires as a Verb

The news was **eagerly** awaited.

envious Feeling or showing envy.

An **envious** glance.

hanker Feel a strong desire for or to do something.

She **hanker**ed to go back.

hankering A yearning for something or to do something.

He had a **hankering** to return to Scotland.

homesick Experiencing a longing for one's home during a period of absence from it.

He was **homesick** for America after five weeks in Europe.

A longing to return home.

homesickness I lived four years in London without a single pang of homesickness.

Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something

<u>insatiable</u> especially sex.

So **insatiable** a gourmand as myself.

jealous Fiercely protective of one's rights or possessions.

A **jealous** husband.

long Long dated securities especially gilts.

Looked out the **long** French windows.

longing Prolonged unfulfilled desire or need.

Minanda falt a wintful langing for the all

Miranda felt a wistful **longing** for the old days.

nostalgia

Something done or presented in order to evoke feelings of nostalgia.

An evening of TV **nostalgia**.

starve Deprive of a necessity and cause suffering.

The arts are being **starve**d of funds.

thirst Feel the need to drink.

A few could drink while many **thirst**ed.

Not able to be quenched.

unquenchable His enthusiasm was unquenchable.



unrequited Not returned in kind.

He s been pining with unrequited love.

want Feel or have a desire for want strongly.

You don t **want** to believe everything you hear.

weariness Extreme tiredness; fatigue.

He began to feel **weariness**.

Desire strongly or persistently.

No fellow spirit **yearn**ed towards her.

Involving or expressing yearning.
