- A procedure for measuring the biochemical or immunological activity of a sample.
- An appraisal of the state of affairs.
- A quantitative or qualitative test of a substance (especially an ore or a drug) to determine its components; frequently used to test for the presence or concentration of infectious agents or antibodies etc.
- The testing of a metal or ore to determine its ingredients and quality.
- A substance that is undergoing an analysis of its components.
- A written report of the results of an analysis of the composition of some substance.

examination	The action or process of conducting an examination. A medical examination is conducted without delay.



inspection	A formal or official examination. On closer inspection it looked like a fossil.
investigation	An inquiry into unfamiliar or questionable activities. <i>He is under investigation for receiving illicit funds.</i>
probe	An unmanned exploratory spacecraft designed to transmit information about its environment. <i>There was a congressional probe into the scandal.</i>
scrutiny	Critical observation or examination. Every aspect of local government was placed under scrutiny .
test	The act of undergoing testing. Researchers developed a test for the virus.
<u>trial</u>	The act of undergoing testing. A sample for ten days free trial .




Usage Examples of "Assay" as a noun

examine	Question or examine thoroughly and closely. The customs agent examine d the baggage.
give one's all	Bestow.
inspect	Examine (someone or something) to ensure that they reach an official standard. <i>Please inspect your father s will carefully.</i>
investigate	Investigate scientifically. The district attorney s office investigate d reports of possible irregularities.
make an effort	Make by shaping or bringing together constituents.
make every effort	Earn on some commercial or business transaction; earn as salary or wages.
probe	Examine physically with or as if with a probe. What right had he to probe into her personal life.
<u>scrutinize</u>	Examine or inspect closely and thoroughly. <i>Customers were warned to</i> scrutinize the small print.
seek	Try to locate or discover, or try to establish the existence of. They came here to seek shelter from biting winter winds.
set out	Insert (a nail or screw below the surface, as into a countersink.
spare no effort	Refrain from harming.
strive	Struggle or fight vigorously. We must strive to secure steady growth.
take it on oneself	Occupy or take on.
test	Put to the test as for its quality or give experimental use to. <i>He tested positive for steroids during the race.</i>



try	Test the limits of. They decided to try for another baby.
venture	Dare to do or say something that may be considered audacious (often used as a polite expression of hesitation or apology. <i>She ventured out into the blizzard.</i>

<u>gold</u>	Made from or covered with gold. Long aureate or gold en hair.
grate	Reduce food to small shreds by rubbing it on a grater. <i>Grate</i> one s teeth in anger.
<u>metal</u>	A mixture containing two or more metallic elements or metallic and nonmetallic elements usually fused together or dissolving into each other when molten. Being a metal aluminium readily conducts heat.
metallic	A paint fabric or colour with a metallic sheen. The strange metallic note of the meadow lark suggesting the clash of vibrant blades.
miner	Laborer who works in a mine. The miner s were freed after spending four days trapped underground.
nickel	Plate with nickel. A button the size of a nickel .
oxide	A binary compound of oxygen with another element or group. <i>Nitrogen oxide</i> .
platinum	Greyish white or silvery like platinum. A platinum wig.
<u>purity</u>	Being undiluted or unmixed with extraneous material. White roses represent purity and innocence.
<u>quarry</u>	Extract stone or other materials from a quarry. <i>Quarry marble.</i>
railing	Material for making rails or rails collectively. Wrought iron railing s.
specie	Coins collectively. The Bank of England in 1795 had held around 8 million in specie .
