- A public facility to meet for open discussion.
- A group of persons who are gathered together for a common purpose.
- The action of gathering together as a group for a common purpose.
- A signal for troops to assemble, given by drum or bugle.
- A unit consisting of components that have been fitted together.
- The social act of assembling.
- A group of machine parts that fit together to form a self-contained unit.
- A group of people elected to make laws or decisions for a particular country or region.


