diligent	Characterized by care and perseverance in carrying out tasks. <i>A diligent detective investigates all clues.</i>
elaborate	Marked by complexity and richness of detail. <i>The elaborate register of the inhabitants prevented tax evasion.</i>
exacting	Making great demands on one's skill, attention, or other resources. <i>An exacting job.</i>
industrious	Working hard to promote an enterprise. <i>An industrious people striving to make their country prosperous.</i>
laborious	Characterized by effort to the point of exhaustion; especially physical effort. <i>Years of laborious training.</i>
meticulous	Showing great attention to detail; very careful and precise. <i>Meticulous research.</i>
minute	Infinitely or immeasurably small. <i>A minute inspection of the grounds.</i>
painstaking	Characterized by extreme care and great effort. <i>He is a gentle painstaking man.</i>
particular	Especially great or intense. <i>The action seems to discriminate against a particular group of companies.</i>
persevering	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>She has been a remarkably steadfast and persevering woman.</i>
punctilious	Showing great attention to detail or correct behaviour. <i>He was punctilious in providing every amenity for his guests.</i>
rigorous	Demanding strict attention to rules and procedures. <i>A rigorous teetotaller.</i>
searching	Thoroughly scrutinizing, especially in a disconcerting way. <i>Searching insights.</i>
sedulous	Marked by care and persistent effort. <i>Sedulous pursuit of legal and moral principles.</i>
studious	Showing great care or attention. <i>His studious absence from public view.</i>
thorough	Performed or written with great care and completeness. <i>Officers have made a thorough examination of the wreckage.</i>

unflagging Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality.

conscientious	Guided by or in accordance with conscience or sense of right and wrong. <i>A conscientious man he took his duties very seriously.</i>
<u>diligence</u>	A diligent effort. <i>Few party members challenge his diligence as an MP.</i>
diligent	Characterized by care and perseverance in carrying out tasks. <i>A diligent detective investigates all clues.</i>
efficiently	In a well-organized and competent way. <i>They recycle waste cheaply and efficiently.</i>
<u>enterprising</u>	Marked by imagination, initiative, and readiness to undertake new projects. <i>An enterprising young man likely to go far.</i>
exactitude	The quality of being exact. <i>He writes with exactitude and precision.</i>
exactness	The quality of being exact. <i>He demanded exactness in all details.</i>
hardworking	Characterized by hard work and perseverance.
indefatigable	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>An indefatigable defender of human rights.</i>
<u>industrious</u>	Diligent and hard-working. <i>An industrious people striving to make their country prosperous.</i>

<u>meticulous</u>	Showing great attention to detail; very careful and precise. A meticulous craftsman.
moralist	A person who teaches or promotes morality.
<u>painstaking</u>	Done with or employing great care and thoroughness. Painstaking research.
painstakingly	In a fastidious and painstaking manner. <i>The property has been painstakingly restored by its current owners.</i>
plodding	(of a person) thorough and hard-working but lacking in imagination or intelligence. Plodding methodical Ralph Bellamy.
<u>precise</u>	(of ideas, images, representations, expressions) characterized by perfect conformity to fact or truth; strictly correct. A precise measurement.
<u>precision</u>	The quality, condition, or fact of being exact and accurate. A precision instrument.
punctilious	Marked by precise accordance with details. <i>He was punctilious in providing every amenity for his guests.</i>
satisfactorily	In a way that fulfils expectations or needs; acceptably. <i>The matter is considered to be satisfactorily resolved.</i>
<u>scholarly</u>	Having or showing knowledge, learning, or devotion to academic pursuits. A scholarly attitude.
scrupulous	Having scruples; arising from a sense of right and wrong; principled. <i>The research has been carried out with scrupulous attention to detail.</i>
sedulous	Marked by care and persistent effort. Sedulous pursuit of legal and moral principles.
<u>studious</u>	Done deliberately or with a purpose in mind. <i>His studious absence from public view.</i>
successfully	In a way that accomplishes a desired aim or result. <i>The plant operated successfully for seventy years.</i>
<u>tireless</u>	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. A tireless worker.
worker	A member of the working class (not necessarily employed). <i>A red flag with the inscription workers of the world unite.</i>
working	(of parts of a machine) moving and causing a machine to operate. <i>The ratio of working men to unemployed.</i>
