Definitions of "Assorted" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “assorted” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Of various sorts put together; miscellaneous.*
- *Of many different kinds purposefully arranged but lacking any uniformity.*
- *Consisting of a haphazard assortment of different kinds.*



Synonyms of "Assorted" as an adjective (19 Words)

- different** Not the same as another or each other; unlike in nature, form, or quality.
*On **different** sides of the issue.*
- differing** Not the same as each other; dissimilar.
*Widely **differing** circumstances.*
- disparate** Containing elements very different from one another.
*A **disparate** aggregate of creeds and songs and prayers.*
- dissimilar** Marked by dissimilarity.
*Took different or **dissimilar** approaches to the problem.*
- diverse** Including or involving people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds and of different genders, sexual orientations, etc.
*Celebrities as **diverse** as Bob Hope and Bob Dylan.*
- diversified** Having variety of character or form or components; or having increased variety.
*A **diversified** musical program ranging from classical to modern.*

eclectic	Deriving ideas, style, or taste from a broad and diverse range of sources. <i>Universities offering an eclectic mix of courses.</i>
heterogeneous	Incommensurable through being of different kinds, degrees, or dimensions. <i>A large and heterogeneous collection.</i>
manifold	Many and varied; having many features or forms. <i>Manifold reasons.</i>
miscellaneous	Having many aspects or qualities. <i>A miscellaneous crowd.</i>
mixed	Involving or composed of different races. <i>The film opened last Friday to mixed reviews.</i>
motley	(of clothing) made up of a variety of colours. <i>A motley crew of discontents and zealots.</i>
multifarious	Many and of various types. <i>Multifarious activities.</i>
multitudinous	Too numerous to be counted. <i>The multitudinous array of chemical substances that exist in the natural world.</i>
sundry	Of various kinds; several. <i>Prawn and garlic vol au vents and sundry other delicacies.</i>
<u>varied</u>	Incorporating a number of different types or elements; showing variation or variety. <i>Her quickly varied answers indicated uncertainty.</i>
variegated	Having a variety of colors. <i>Variegated foliage.</i>
<u>various</u>	Having great diversity or variety. <i>Their environments are locally various.</i>
<u>varying</u>	Marked by diversity or difference. <i>Varying degrees of success.</i>

Marked by dissimilarity.
*The pleasures of the romance novel are not **dissimilar** from those of the chocolate bar.*

diverse

Including or involving people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds and of different genders, sexual orientations, etc.
*Celebrities as **diverse** as Bob Hope and Bob Dylan.*

diversity

A range of different things.
*Equality and **diversity** should be supported for their own sake.*

heterogeneous

Originating outside the body.
*A large and **heterogeneous** collection.*

<u>infinity</u>	An infinite or very great number or amount. <i>The transmission approaches 100 as the frequency tends to infinity.</i>
<u>innumerable</u>	Too many to be counted (often used hyperbolically). <i>Innumerable flags of all colours.</i>
manifold	Having many different forms or elements. <i>The appeal of the crusade was manifold.</i>
many	The majority of people. <i>Take as many apples as you like.</i>
miscellaneous	(of a collection or group) composed of members or elements of different kinds. <i>Miscellaneous accessories.</i>
miscellany	A group or collection of different items; a mixture. <i>A miscellany of houses.</i>
mixed	(especially of an educational establishment or a sports team or competition) of or for members of both sexes. <i>Crab on a bed of mixed salad.</i>
motley	Make motley color with different colors. <i>A motley of interacting interest groups.</i>
<u>multifaceted</u>	Having many aspects. <i>His extraordinary and multifaceted career.</i>
multifarious	Having many aspects. <i>Multifarious interests.</i>
<u>multiple</u>	A number that may be divided by another a certain number of times without a remainder. <i>A multiple fracture of the femur.</i>
multiplicity	A large number. <i>The demand for higher education depends on a multiplicity of factors.</i>
<u>multitude</u>	A large indefinite number. <i>Father Peter addressed the multitude.</i>
<u>myriad</u>	Countless or extremely great in number. <i>Myriads of insects danced around the light above my head.</i>
numerous	Great in number; many. <i>Numerous times.</i>
pastiche	A work of art that imitates the style of some previous work. <i>A pastiche of literary models and sources.</i>
pluralism	The practice of one person holding more than one benefice at a time.

plurality	The number by which plurality exceeds the number of votes cast for the candidate placed second. <i>A plurality of religions.</i>
potpourri	A jar of mixed flower petals and spices used as perfume. <i>He played a potpourri of tunes from Gilbert and Sullivan.</i>
sundry	Of various kinds; several. <i>Prawn and garlic vol au vents and sundry other delicacies.</i>
varied	Characterized by variety. <i>Her quickly varied answers indicated uncertainty.</i>
variegated	(of a plant or foliage) having or consisting of leaves that are edged or patterned in a second colour, especially white as well as green. <i>His variegated and amusing observations.</i>
variety	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>A variety show.</i>
various	Different from one another; of different kinds or sorts. <i>Cited various reasons for his behavior.</i>
variously	In diverse ways. <i>The alternatives that are variously represented by the participants.</i>
