### Definitions of "Assorted" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “assorted” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Of various sorts put together; miscellaneous.*
- *Of many different kinds purposefully arranged but lacking any uniformity.*
- *Consisting of a haphazard assortment of different kinds.*



## Synonyms of "Assorted" as an adjective (19 Words)

<b>different</b>	Not the same as another or each other; unlike in nature, form, or quality. <i>On <b>different</b> sides of the issue.</i>
<b><u>differing</u></b>	Not the same as each other; dissimilar. <i>Widely <b>differing</b> circumstances.</i>
<b><u>disparate</u></b>	Containing elements very different from one another. <i>A <b>disparate</b> aggregate of creeds and songs and prayers.</i>
<b><u>dissimilar</u></b>	Marked by dissimilarity. <i>Took different or <b>dissimilar</b> approaches to the problem.</i>
<b>diverse</b>	Including or involving people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds and of different genders, sexual orientations, etc. <i>Celebrities as <b>diverse</b> as Bob Hope and Bob Dylan.</i>
<b><u>diversified</u></b>	Having variety of character or form or components; or having increased variety. <i>A <b>diversified</b> musical program ranging from classical to modern.</i>

<b>eclectic</b>	Deriving ideas, style, or taste from a broad and diverse range of sources. <i>Universities offering an <b>eclectic</b> mix of courses.</i>
<b>heterogeneous</b>	Incommensurable through being of different kinds, degrees, or dimensions. <i>A large and <b>heterogeneous</b> collection.</i>
<b>manifold</b>	Many and varied; having many features or forms. <i><b>Manifold</b> reasons.</i>
<b>miscellaneous</b>	Having many aspects or qualities. <i>A <b>miscellaneous</b> crowd.</i>
<b>mixed</b>	Involving or composed of different races. <i>The film opened last Friday to <b>mixed</b> reviews.</i>
<b>motley</b>	(of clothing) made up of a variety of colours. <i>A <b>motley</b> crew of discontents and zealots.</i>
<b>multifarious</b>	Many and of various types. <i><b>Multifarious</b> activities.</i>
<b>multitudinous</b>	Too numerous to be counted. <i>The <b>multitudinous</b> array of chemical substances that exist in the natural world.</i>
<b>sundry</b>	Of various kinds; several. <i>Prawn and garlic vol au vents and <b>sundry</b> other delicacies.</i>
<u><b>varied</b></u>	Incorporating a number of different types or elements; showing variation or variety. <i>Her quickly <b>varied</b> answers indicated uncertainty.</i>
<b>variegated</b>	Having a variety of colors. <i><b>Variegated</b> foliage.</i>
<u><b>various</b></u>	Having great diversity or variety. <i>Their environments are locally <b>various</b>.</i>
<u><b>varying</b></u>	Marked by diversity or difference. <i><b>Varying</b> degrees of success.</i>

Marked by dissimilarity.

The pleasures of the romance novel are not **dissimilar** from those of the chocolate bar.

### **diverse**

Including or involving people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds and of different genders, sexual orientations, etc.

Celebrities as **diverse** as Bob Hope and Bob Dylan.

### **diversity**

A range of different things.

Equality and **diversity** should be supported for their own sake.

### **heterogeneous**

Originating outside the body.

A large and **heterogeneous** collection.

<b><u>infinity</u></b>	An infinite or very great number or amount. <i>The transmission approaches 100 as the frequency tends to <b>infinity</b>.</i>
<b><u>innumerable</u></b>	Too many to be counted (often used hyperbolically). <i><b>Innumerable</b> flags of all colours.</i>
<b>manifold</b>	Having many different forms or elements. <i>The appeal of the crusade was <b>manifold</b>.</i>
<b>many</b>	The majority of people. <i>Take as <b>many</b> apples as you like.</i>
<b>miscellaneous</b>	(of a collection or group) composed of members or elements of different kinds. <i><b>Miscellaneous</b> accessories.</i>
<b>miscellany</b>	A group or collection of different items; a mixture. <i>A <b>miscellany</b> of houses.</i>
<b>mixed</b>	(especially of an educational establishment or a sports team or competition) of or for members of both sexes. <i>Crab on a bed of <b>mixed</b> salad.</i>
<b>motley</b>	Make motley color with different colors. <i>A <b>motley</b> of interacting interest groups.</i>
<b><u>multifaceted</u></b>	Having many aspects. <i>His extraordinary and <b>multifaceted</b> career.</i>
<b>multifarious</b>	Having many aspects. <i><b>Multifarious</b> interests.</i>
<b><u>multiple</u></b>	A number that may be divided by another a certain number of times without a remainder. <i>A <b>multiple</b> fracture of the femur.</i>
<b>multiplicity</b>	A large number. <i>The demand for higher education depends on a <b>multiplicity</b> of factors.</i>
<b><u>multitude</u></b>	A large indefinite number. <i>Father Peter addressed the <b>multitude</b>.</i>
<b><u>myriad</u></b>	Countless or extremely great in number. <i><b>Myriads</b> of insects danced around the light above my head.</i>
<b>numerous</b>	Great in number; many. <i><b>Numerous</b> times.</i>
<b>pastiche</b>	A work of art that imitates the style of some previous work. <i>A <b>pastiche</b> of literary models and sources.</i>
<b>pluralism</b>	The practice of one person holding more than one benefice at a time.

<b>plurality</b>	The number by which plurality exceeds the number of votes cast for the candidate placed second. <i>A <b>plurality</b> of religions.</i>
<b>potpourri</b>	A jar of mixed flower petals and spices used as perfume. <i>He played a <b>potpourri</b> of tunes from Gilbert and Sullivan.</i>
<b>sundry</b>	Of various kinds; several. <i>Prawn and garlic vol au vents and <b>sundry</b> other delicacies.</i>
<b>varied</b>	Characterized by variety. <i>Her quickly <b>varied</b> answers indicated uncertainty.</i>
<b>variegated</b>	(of a plant or foliage) having or consisting of leaves that are edged or patterned in a second colour, especially white as well as green. <i>His <b>variegated</b> and amusing observations.</i>
<b>variety</b>	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>A <b>variety</b> show.</i>
<b>various</b>	Different from one another; of different kinds or sorts. <i>Cited <b>various</b> reasons for his behavior.</i>
<b>variously</b>	In diverse ways. <i>The alternatives that are <b>variously</b> represented by the participants.</i>
