Associations of "Assuredly" (30 Words)

absolutely	Used to express and emphasize one’s assent or agreement. <i>He absolutely adores that car.</i>
apparent	Appearing as such but not necessarily so. <i>It became apparent that he was talented.</i>
apparently	Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly’). <i>She has apparently been living here for some time.</i>
assured	Protected against discontinuance or change. <i>We can never have completely assured lives.</i>
certainly	Definitely or positively (‘sure’ is sometimes used informally for ‘surely’). <i>The prestigious address certainly adds to the firm’s appeal.</i>
certainty	A person that is certain to do or win the specified thing. <i>A man exuding certainty.</i>
certitude	Absolute certainty or conviction that something is the case. <i>The question may never be answered with certitude.</i>
clear	Clear and distinct to the senses easily perceptible. <i>She cleared 1 50 metres in the high jump.</i>
clearly	Clear to the mind; with distinct mental discernment. <i>Her ability to write clearly.</i>
decidedly	Without question and beyond doubt. <i>He looked decidedly uncomfortable.</i>
decisively	With finality; conclusively. <i>Samples from his body proved decisively that he was poisoned.</i>
definitely	In a definite manner; clearly. <i>I shall definitely be at the airport to meet you.</i>
doubtless	Certainly; without doubt. <i>The company would doubtless find the reduced competition to their liking.</i>

evidently	Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly’). <i>She was in bed and evidently in great pain.</i>
expressly	Explicitly; clearly. <i>The house was expressly built for entertaining.</i>
indeed	Expressing interest of an ironic kind with repetition of a question just asked. <i>The idea is attractive to many men and indeed to many women.</i>
indubitable	Impossible to doubt; unquestionable. <i>An indubitable truth.</i>
indubitably	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>Indubitably liberalism parades under many guises.</i>
justified	Having words so spaced that lines have straight even margins. <i>Justified right margins.</i>
markedly	In a clearly noticeable manner. <i>New diagnoses have increased markedly since 1998.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>It was obvious a storm was coming in.</i>
obviously	Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly’). <i>She was obviously unwell.</i>
outweigh	Weigh more heavily. <i>These considerations outweigh our wishes.</i>
rightly	In accordance with justice or what is morally right. <i>The delicious cuisine for which her country was rightly famous.</i>
seemingly	From appearances alone. <i>The child is seemingly healthy but the doctor is concerned.</i>
sure	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>They thought he had been killed sure enough.</i>
surely	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>No one knows how to move the economy quickly and surely in that direction.</i>
truly	In a truthful way. <i>A truly dreadful song.</i>
undoubtedly	Without doubt; certainly. <i>It is undoubtedly very beautiful.</i>
unquestionably	Without question and beyond doubt. <i>The awards were unquestionably deserved.</i>
