## Associations of "Assuredly" (30 Words)

<b>absolutely</b>	Used to express and emphasize one’s assent or agreement. <i>He <b>absolutely</b> adores that car.</i>
<b><a href="#">apparent</a></b>	Appearing as such but not necessarily so. <i>It became <b>apparent</b> that he was talented.</i>
<b><a href="#">apparently</a></b>	Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly’). <i>She has <b>apparently</b> been living here for some time.</i>
<b>assured</b>	Protected against discontinuance or change. <i>We can never have completely <b>assured</b> lives.</i>
<b><a href="#">certainly</a></b>	Definitely or positively (‘sure’ is sometimes used informally for ‘surely’). <i>The prestigious address <b>certainly</b> adds to the firm’s appeal.</i>
<b><a href="#">certainty</a></b>	A person that is certain to do or win the specified thing. <i>A man exuding <b>certainty</b>.</i>
<b>certitude</b>	Absolute certainty or conviction that something is the case. <i>The question may never be answered with <b>certitude</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">clear</a></b>	Clear and distinct to the senses easily perceptible. <i>She <b>cleared</b> 1 50 metres in the high jump.</i>
<b>clearly</b>	Clear to the mind; with distinct mental discernment. <i>Her ability to write <b>clearly</b>.</i>
<b>decidedly</b>	Without question and beyond doubt. <i>He looked <b>decidedly</b> uncomfortable.</i>
<b>decisively</b>	With finality; conclusively. <i>Samples from his body proved <b>decisively</b> that he was poisoned.</i>
<b>definitely</b>	In a definite manner; clearly. <i>I shall <b>definitely</b> be at the airport to meet you.</i>
<b><a href="#">doubtless</a></b>	Certainly; without doubt. <i>The company would <b>doubtless</b> find the reduced competition to their liking.</i>

<b>evidently</b>	Unmistakably (`plain' is often used informally for `plainly. <i>She was in bed and <b>evidently</b> in great pain.</i>
<b>expressly</b>	Explicitly; clearly. <i>The house was <b>expressly</b> built for entertaining.</i>
<b>indeed</b>	Expressing interest of an ironic kind with repetition of a question just asked. <i>The idea is attractive to many men and <b>indeed</b> to many women.</i>
<b>indubitable</b>	Impossible to doubt; unquestionable. <i>An <b>indubitable</b> truth.</i>
<b>indubitably</b>	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i><b>Indubitably</b> liberalism parades under many guises.</i>
<b>justified</b>	Having words so spaced that lines have straight even margins. <i><b>Justified</b> right margins.</i>
<b>markedly</b>	In a clearly noticeable manner. <i>New diagnoses have increased <b>markedly</b> since 1998.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>It was <b>obvious</b> a storm was coming in.</i>
<b>obviously</b>	Unmistakably (`plain' is often used informally for `plainly. <i>She was <b>obviously</b> unwell.</i>
<b>outweigh</b>	Weigh more heavily. <i>These considerations <b>outweigh</b> our wishes.</i>
<b>rightly</b>	In accordance with justice or what is morally right. <i>The delicious cuisine for which her country was <b>rightly</b> famous.</i>
<b>seemingly</b>	From appearances alone. <i>The child is <b>seemingly</b> healthy but the doctor is concerned.</i>
<b>sure</b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>They thought he had been killed <b>sure</b> enough.</i>
<b>surely</b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>No one knows how to move the economy quickly and <b>surely</b> in that direction.</i>
<b>truly</b>	In a truthful way. <i>A <b>truly</b> dreadful song.</i>
<b>undoubtedly</b>	Without doubt; certainly. <i>It s <b>undoubtedly</b> very beautiful.</i>
<b>unquestionably</b>	Without question and beyond doubt. <i>The awards were <b>unquestionably</b> deserved.</i>
