Astonished as an Adjective

Definitions of "Astonished" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “astonished” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Greatly surprised or impressed; amazed.*
- *Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.*



Synonyms of "Astonished" as an adjective (4 Words)

amazed Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.
*Chandler looked absolutely **amazed**.*

astonied Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.

astounded Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.
***Astounded** viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.*

stunned In a state of mental numbness especially as resulting from shock.
***Stunned** scientists found not one but at least three viruses.*



Usage Examples of "Astonished" as an adjective

- *I stood enthralled, astonished by the vastness and majesty of the cathedral.*
- *We were astonished to hear of this decision.*
- *He was astonished at the change in him.*



Associations of "Astonished" (30 Words)

abominable	Very bad; terrible. <i>Abominable treatment of prisoners.</i>
afraid	Feeling fear or anxiety; frightened. <i>Afraid of hard work.</i>
aghast	Filled with horror or shock. <i>She winced aghast at his cruelty.</i>
amaze	Surprise (someone) greatly; fill with astonishment. <i>Your ability to speak six languages amazes me.</i>
amazed	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>I was amazed that he could remember me.</i>
astonish	Affect with wonder. <i>You never fail to astonish me.</i>

<u>astonishing</u>	Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing. <i>I find it astonishing that they ever thought it could work.</i>
astounded	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>Astounded viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.</i>
<u>astounding</u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The summit offers astounding views.</i>
bemuse	Cause to be confused emotionally. <i>He was bemused by what was happening.</i>
confused	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. <i>A confused dream about the end of the world.</i>
<u>dismayed</u>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<u>flabbergasted</u>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>The flabbergasted aldermen were speechless.</i>
<u>formidable</u>	Inspiring fear or respect through being impressively large, powerful, intense, or capable. <i>Had a formidable array of compositions to his credit.</i>
<u>puzzled</u>	Filled with bewilderment. <i>She looked puzzled and angry with him.</i>
quizzical	Perplexed (as if being expected to know something that you do not know). <i>His face wore a somewhat quizzical almost impertinent air.</i>
redoubtable	Worthy of respect or honor. <i>He was a redoubtable debater.</i>
<u>scare</u>	Become scared. <i>Recent food scares have made the public rightly sensitive to new apparently untested technologies.</i>
scared	Made afraid. <i>We re both scared of spiders.</i>
<u>shattered</u>	Very upset. <i>He was said to be absolutely shattered after losing his job.</i>
shock	Subject to electrical shocks. <i>Shock grain.</i>
<u>shocked</u>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<u>shocking</u>	Very bad. <i>I ve got a shocking cold.</i>
<u>staggering</u>	Deeply shocking; astonishing. <i>The amount of money required was staggering.</i>

<u>startle</u>	Cause to feel sudden shock or alarm. <i>He was startled to see a column of smoke.</i>
<u>startled</u>	Excited by sudden surprise or alarm and making a quick involuntary movement. <i>Students startled by the teacher's quiet return.</i>
stupefy	Astonish and shock. <i>The amount they spend on clothes would appal their parents and stupefy their grandparents.</i>
surprise	Cause to be surprised. <i>Much to her surprise she'd missed him.</i>
surprised	Feeling or showing surprise. <i>Surprised that he remembered my name.</i>
<u>wondering</u>	Showing curiosity. <i>Unsure where she was leading to I cast her a wondering look.</i>
