### **Definitions of "Astonished" as an adjective**

- *Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.*



### Synonyms of "Astonished" as an adjective (4 Words)

**amazed** Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.  
*Chandler looked absolutely **amazed**.*

**astonied** Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.

**astounded** Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.  
***Astounded** viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.*

**stunned** In a state of mental numbness especially as resulting from shock.  
***Stunned** scientists found not one but at least three viruses.*



### **Usage Examples of "Astonished" as an adjective**

- *I stood enthralled, astonished by the vastness and majesty of the cathedral.*
- *We were astonished to hear of this decision.*
- *He was astonished at the change in him.*





## Associations of "Astonished" (30 Words)

<b>abominable</b>	Very bad; terrible. <i><b>Abominable</b> treatment of prisoners.</i>
<b>afraid</b>	Feeling fear or anxiety; frightened. <i><b>Afraid</b> of hard work.</i>
<b>aghast</b>	Filled with horror or shock. <i>She winced <b>aghast</b> at his cruelty.</i>
<b>amaze</b>	Surprise (someone) greatly; fill with astonishment. <i>Your ability to speak six languages <b>amazes</b> me.</i>
<b>amazed</b>	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>I was <b>amazed</b> that he could remember me.</i>
<b>astonish</b>	Affect with wonder. <i>You never fail to <b>astonish</b> me.</i>

<b><u>astonishing</u></b>	Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing. <i>I find it <b>astonishing</b> that they ever thought it could work.</i>
<b>astounded</b>	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i><b>Astounded</b> viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.</i>
<b><u>astounding</u></b>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The summit offers <b>astounding</b> views.</i>
<b>bemuse</b>	Cause to be confused emotionally. <i>He was <b>bemused</b> by what was happening.</i>
<b>confused</b>	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. <i>A <b>confused</b> dream about the end of the world.</i>
<b><u>dismayed</u></b>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<b><u>flabbergasted</u></b>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>The <b>flabbergasted</b> aldermen were speechless.</i>
<b><u>formidable</u></b>	Inspiring fear or respect through being impressively large, powerful, intense, or capable. <i>Had a <b>formidable</b> array of compositions to his credit.</i>
<b><u>puzzled</u></b>	Filled with bewilderment. <i>She looked <b>puzzled</b> and angry with him.</i>
<b>quizzical</b>	Perplexed (as if being expected to know something that you do not know). <i>His face wore a somewhat <b>quizzical</b> almost impertinent air.</i>
<b>redoubtable</b>	Worthy of respect or honor. <i>He was a <b>redoubtable</b> debater.</i>
<b><u>scare</u></b>	Become scared. <i>Recent food <b>scares</b> have made the public rightly sensitive to new apparently untested technologies.</i>
<b>scared</b>	Made afraid. <i>We re both <b>scared</b> of spiders.</i>
<b><u>shattered</u></b>	Very upset. <i>He was said to be absolutely <b>shattered</b> after losing his job.</i>
<b>shock</b>	Subject to electrical shocks. <i><b>Shock</b> grain.</i>
<b><u>shocked</u></b>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<b><u>shocking</u></b>	Very bad. <i>I ve got a <b>shocking</b> cold.</i>
<b><u>staggering</u></b>	Deeply shocking; astonishing. <i>The amount of money required was <b>staggering</b>.</i>

<b><u>startle</u></b>	Cause to feel sudden shock or alarm. <i>He was <b>startled</b> to see a column of smoke.</i>
<b><u>startled</u></b>	Excited by sudden surprise or alarm and making a quick involuntary movement. <i>Students <b>startled</b> by the teacher's quiet return.</i>
<b>stupefy</b>	Astonish and shock. <i>The amount they spend on clothes would appal their parents and <b>stupefy</b> their grandparents.</i>
<b>surprise</b>	Cause to be surprised. <i>Much to her <b>surprise</b> she'd missed him.</i>
<b>surprised</b>	Feeling or showing surprise. <i><b>Surprised</b> that he remembered my name.</i>
<b><u>wondering</u></b>	Showing curiosity. <i>Unsure where she was leading to I cast her a <b>wondering</b> look.</i>
