stupefying So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm.

Stupefying financial incompetence.

Causing surprise; unexpected.

surprising

The report shows a surprising lack of hard factual data.

miraculously

The two drivers miraculously escaped with only minor injuries.

prodigious Far beyond what is usual in magnitude or degree. The stove consumed a **prodigious** amount of fuel.

redoubtable (of a person) formidable, especially as an opponent.

The **redoubtable** ladies.

shattering Seemingly loud enough to break something; violently rattling or clattering.

Shattering rain striking the windowpanes.

Collect or gather into shocks.

shock The home made lighting gave my father a **shock** when he touched the

aquarium.

shocking Causing indignation or disgust; offensive.

Shocking behaviour.

staggering So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm.

The amount of money required was **staggering**.

Very surprising, astonishing, or remarkable.

Startling Startling earthquake shocks.

So great in size or force or extent as to elicit awe.

stupendousStupendous demand.

surprisedTaken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment.

Surprised that he remembered my name.

surprisingly In an amazing manner; to everyone's surprise.

Beyond belief or understanding.

Unbelievable or not it happened.

unexpected Not expected or anticipated.

He seemed to have a knack for saying the **unexpected**.

unexpectedly In a way that was not expected or regarded as likely. He died **unexpectedly** of a heart attack.

unusuallyTo a remarkable or unusual extent; exceptionally.

There were an **unusually** large number of excellent performances.

wonderful Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers.

The climate was **wonderful** all the year round.

wondering Characterized by or expressive of a desire to know something; curious.

Unsure where she was leading to I cast her a **wondering** look.
