amazing	Surprising greatly. <i>New York is an amazing city.</i>
<u>astonishing</u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>An astonishing achievement.</i>
<u>bewildering</u>	Confusing or perplexing. <i>There is a bewildering array of holidays to choose from.</i>
<u>breathtaking</u>	Astonishing or awe-inspiring in quality, so as to take one's breath away. <i>The scene was one of breathtaking beauty.</i>
dumbfounding	Bewildering or striking dumb with wonder.
dumfounding	Bewildering or striking dumb with wonder.
<u>impressive</u>	Producing a strong effect. <i>Gave an impressive performance as Othello.</i>
<u>shocking</u>	Causing indignation or disgust; offensive. <i>I ve got a shocking cold.</i>

staggering

Deeply shocking; astonishing.

*The **staggering** bills for maintenance and repair.*

striking

Sensational in appearance or thrilling in effect.

*His **striking** good looks always created a sensation.*

stunning

Strikingly beautiful or attractive.

*She looked **stunning**.*

stupefying

So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm.

*The figure inside the boucle dress was **stupefying**.*

surprising

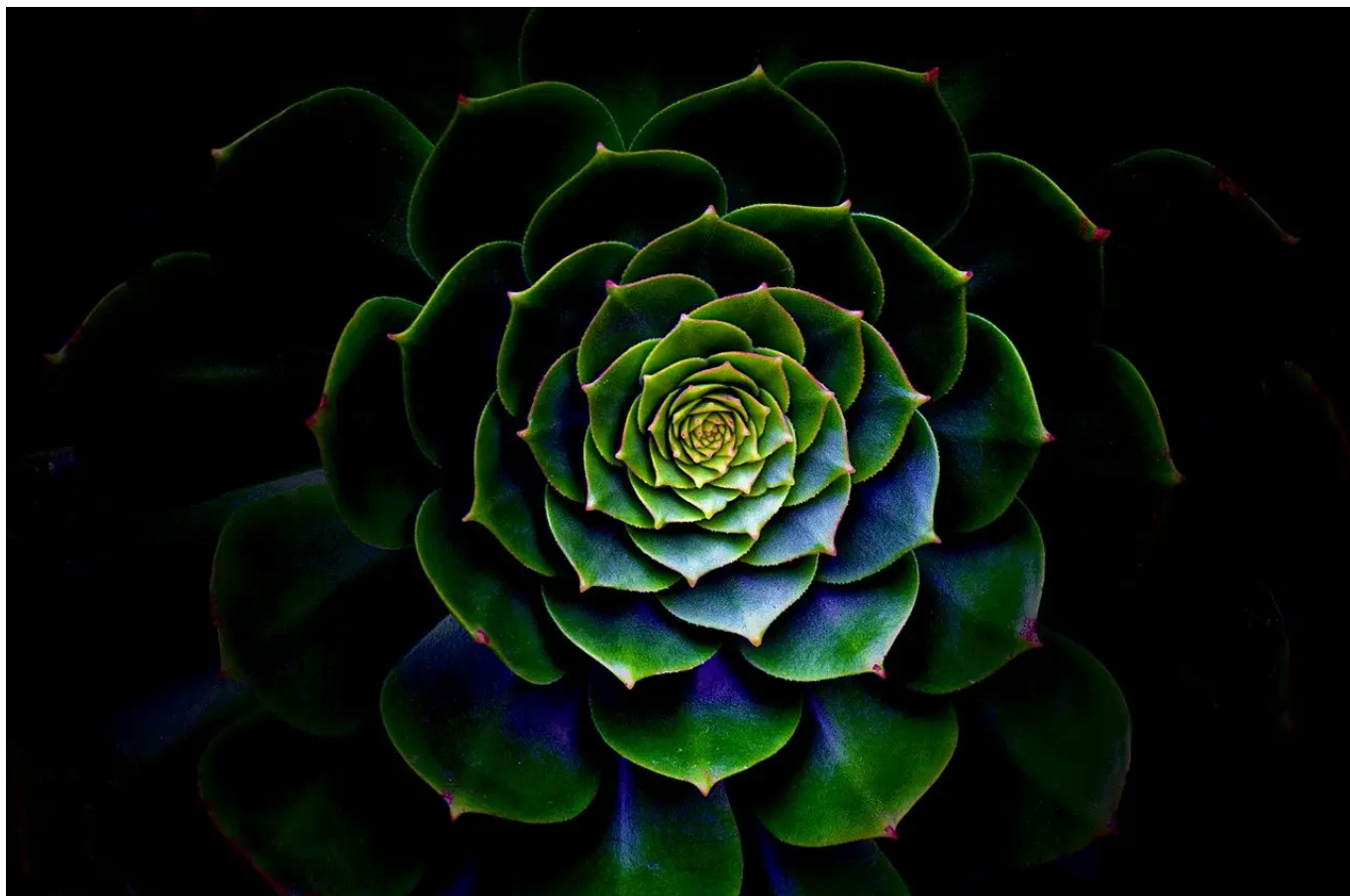
Causing surprise or wonder or amazement.

*A **surprising** sequence of events.*



Usage Examples of "Astounding" as an adjective

- *An astounding achievement.*
- *The summit offers astounding views.*



Associations of "Astounding" (30 Words)

<u>amaze</u>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>He has been amazed by the quality of the employees at the bank.</i>
<u>amazement</u>	A feeling of great surprise or wonder. <i>To her amazement Bill was keen.</i>
amazing	Surprising greatly. <i>She does an amazing amount of work.</i>
astonish	Surprise or impress (someone) greatly. <i>You never fail to astonish me.</i>
<u>astonishing</u>	Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing. <i>The dog was capable of astonishing tricks.</i>
astound	Shock or greatly surprise. <i>Her bluntness astounded him.</i>

awesome	Extremely well; excellently. <i>The awesome complexity of the universe.</i>
daze	Overcome as with astonishment or disbelief. <i>She was dazed by his revelations.</i>
flabbergasted	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>The flabbergasted aldermen were speechless.</i>
grisly	Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror. <i>A grisly murder.</i>
gruesome	Extremely unpleasant. <i>The most gruesome murder.</i>
incredible	Very good; wonderful. <i>At incredible speed.</i>
marvelous	Being or having the character of a miracle. <i>A marvelous collection of rare books.</i>
profound	Profound quality. <i>Profound contempt.</i>
puzzled	Unable to understand; perplexed. <i>Puzzled that she left without saying goodbye.</i>
redoubtable	(of a person) formidable, especially as an opponent. <i>The redoubtable ladies.</i>
serendipity	Good luck in making unexpected and fortunate discoveries. <i>A fortunate stroke of serendipity.</i>
shattered	Very upset. <i>He was said to be absolutely shattered after losing his job.</i>
shock	Affect with physiological shock or with an electric shock. <i>All the jars and jolts were smoothed out by the shock absorbers.</i>
skittish	(of a person) playfully frivolous or unpredictable. <i>A skittish chestnut mare.</i>
spooky	Unpredictably excitable (especially of horses). <i>Some horses are more spooky by nature than others.</i>
staggering	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>Suffered a staggering defeat.</i>
startle	A sudden involuntary movement. <i>He was startled to see a column of smoke.</i>
stupefy	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to stupefy her.</i>

surprise	Cause to be surprised. Surprise <i>major.</i>
surprised	Feeling or showing surprise. Surprised <i>that he remembered my name.</i>
<u>surprising</u>	Causing surprise; unexpected. <i>Leaped up with surprising agility.</i>
<u>surprisingly</u>	In an amazing manner; to everyone's surprise. <i>He rather surprisingly took up the cause.</i>
<u>unbelievable</u>	Not able to be believed; unlikely to be true. <i>Your audacity is unbelievable.</i>
wonderful	Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers. <i>They all think she s wonderful.</i>
