<b><u>astonishing</u></b>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>An <b>astonishing</b> achievement.</i>
<b><u>bewildering</u></b>	Confusing or perplexing. <i>There is a <b>bewildering</b> array of holidays to choose from.</i>
<b><u>breathtaking</u></b>	Astonishing or awe-inspiring in quality, so as to take one's breath away. <i>The scene was one of <b>breathtaking</b> beauty.</i>
<b>dumbfounding</b>	Bewildering or striking dumb with wonder.
<b>dumfounding</b>	Bewildering or striking dumb with wonder.
<b><u>impressive</u></b>	Producing a strong effect. <i>Gave an <b>impressive</b> performance as Othello.</i>
<b><u>shocking</u></b>	Causing indignation or disgust; offensive. <i>I ve got a <b>shocking</b> cold.</i>

<b><u>staggering</u></b>	Deeply shocking; astonishing. <i>The <b>staggering</b> bills for maintenance and repair.</i>
<b><u>striking</u></b>	Sensational in appearance or thrilling in effect. <i>His <b>striking</b> good looks always created a sensation.</i>
<b>stunning</b>	Strikingly beautiful or attractive. <i>She looked <b>stunning</b>.</i>
<b>stupefying</b>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The figure inside the boucle dress was <b>stupefying</b>.</i>
<b><u>surprising</u></b>	Causing surprise or wonder or amazement. <i>A <b>surprising</b> sequence of events.</i>

## Associations of "Astounding" (30 Words)

<b><u>amaze</u></b>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>He has been <b>amazed</b> by the quality of the employees at the bank.</i>
<b><u>amazement</u></b>	A feeling of great surprise or wonder. <i>To her <b>amazement</b> Bill was keen.</i>
<b>amazing</b>	Surprising greatly. <i>She does an <b>amazing</b> amount of work.</i>
<b>astonish</b>	Surprise or impress (someone) greatly. <i>You never fail to <b>astonish</b> me.</i>
<b><u>astonishing</u></b>	Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing. <i>The dog was capable of <b>astonishing</b> tricks.</i>
<b>astound</b>	Shock or greatly surprise. <i>Her bluntness <b>astounded</b> him.</i>

<b>awesome</b>	Extremely well; excellently. <i>The <b>awesome</b> complexity of the universe.</i>
<b>daze</b>	Overcome as with astonishment or disbelief. <i>She was <b>dazed</b> by his revelations.</i>
<b>flabbergasted</b>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>The <b>flabbergasted</b> aldermen were speechless.</i>
<b>grisly</b>	Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror. <i>A <b>grisly</b> murder.</i>
<b>gruesome</b>	Extremely unpleasant. <i>The most <b>gruesome</b> murder.</i>
<b>incredible</b>	Very good; wonderful. <i>At <b>incredible</b> speed.</i>
<b>marvelous</b>	Being or having the character of a miracle. <i>A <b>marvelous</b> collection of rare books.</i>
<b>profound</b>	Profound quality. <i><b>Profound</b> contempt.</i>
<b>puzzled</b>	Unable to understand; perplexed. <i><b>Puzzled</b> that she left without saying goodbye.</i>
<b>redoubtable</b>	(of a person) formidable, especially as an opponent. <i>The <b>redoubtable</b> ladies.</i>
<b>serendipity</b>	Good luck in making unexpected and fortunate discoveries. <i>A fortunate stroke of <b>serendipity</b>.</i>
<b>shattered</b>	Very upset. <i>He was said to be absolutely <b>shattered</b> after losing his job.</i>
<b>shock</b>	Affect with physiological shock or with an electric shock. <i>All the jars and jolts were smoothed out by the <b>shock</b> absorbers.</i>
<b>skittish</b>	(of a person) playfully frivolous or unpredictable. <i>A <b>skittish</b> chestnut mare.</i>
<b>spooky</b>	Unpredictably excitable (especially of horses). <i>Some horses are more <b>spooky</b> by nature than others.</i>
<b>staggering</b>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>Suffered a <b>staggering</b> defeat.</i>
<b>startle</b>	A sudden involuntary movement. <i>He was <b>startled</b> to see a column of smoke.</i>
<b>stupefy</b>	Be a mystery or bewildering to. <i>The offence of administering drugs to a woman with intent to <b>stupefy</b> her.</i>

<b>surprise</b>	Cause to be surprised. <b>Surprise</b> major.
<b>surprised</b>	Feeling or showing surprise. <b>Surprised</b> that he remembered my name.
<b>surprising</b>	Causing surprise; unexpected. Leaped up with <b>surprising</b> agility.
<b>surprisingly</b>	In an amazing manner; to everyone's surprise. He rather <b>surprisingly</b> took up the cause.
<b>unbelievable</b>	Not able to be believed; unlikely to be true. Your audacity is <b>unbelievable</b> .
<b>wonderful</b>	Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers. They all think she s <b>wonderful</b> .
