Associations of "Astride" (30 Words)

athwart	Across from side to side; transversely. One table running athwart was all the room would hold.
<u>auditorium</u>	The part of a theatre, concert hall, or other public building in which the audience sits. The National Indoor Arena is a magnificent auditorium and one of Britain s premier indoor venues.
bedspread	A decorative cloth used to cover a bed when it is not in use.
<u>bench</u>	Exhibit on a bench. <i>The Conservative </i> bench es.

flop	With a flopping sound. Liz flop ped down into the armchair.
girth	A band attached to a saddle and fastened around a horse's belly to keep the saddle in place. An ivy clad tree of immense girth .
idly	In an idle manner. I can no longer stand idly by and let him take the blame.
incubate	Grow under conditions that promote development. The BSE bug incubate s for around three years.
kneel	Be in or assume a position in which the body is supported by a knee or the knees, as when praying or showing submission. In church you have to kneel during parts of the service.
nestle	Lie in a sheltered position. The little cottage nestle s in the forest.
<u>park</u>	Maneuver a vehicle into a parking space. Penguin chicks are reared regularly at the park .
pommel	A handgrip that a gymnast uses when performing exercises on a pommel horse.
proscenium	The wall that separates the stage from the auditorium in a modern theater.
recliner	An armchair whose back can be lowered and foot can be raised to allow the sitter to recline in it.
rein	Stop or check by or as if by a pull at the reins. He rein ed in his horses in front of the post office.
saddle	Put a saddle on. A recipe for saddle of hare.
seat	Put a seat on a chair. The host seat ed me next to Mrs Smith.
<u>sit</u>	Cause someone to sit. The manager must decide who to sit in the World Series.
