| <u>cosmos</u> | The universe seen as a well-ordered whole. <i>The new gender free intellectual cosmos.</i> |
| divination | A prediction uttered under divine inspiration. <i>The mediums are hired to perform divinations.</i> |
| forecaster | A person who predicts or estimates a future event or trend. <i>Economic forecasters are predicting a downturn.</i> |
| forecasting | A statement made about the future. |
| foretell | Indicate, as with a sign or an omen. <i>A seer had foretold that the earl would assume the throne.</i> |
| horoscope | A prediction of someone's future based on the relative positions of the planets. <i>He gave lectures on astrology and cast horoscopes in his spare time.</i> |
| libra | The seventh sign of the zodiac; the sun is in this sign from about September 23 to October 22. |
| pisces | A person who is born while the sun is in Pisces. |
| predict | Make a prediction about tell in advance. <i>It is too early to predict a result.</i> |
| prediction | The action of predicting something. <i>The prediction of future behaviour.</i> |
| predictive | Of or relating to prediction; having value for making predictions. <i>The virtual keyboard uses predictive text.</i> |
| prognostication | A sign of something about to happen. <i>These gloomy prognostications proved to be unfounded.</i> |
| <u>prophecy</u> | Knowledge of the future (usually said to be obtained from a divine source). <i>A bleak prophecy of war and ruin.</i> |
| sidereal | Of or relating to the stars or constellations. |
