According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “astronaut” as a noun can have the following definitions:


- *A person trained to travel in a spacecraft.*

Synonyms of "Astronaut" as a noun (7 Words)

cosmonaut	A Russian astronaut. <i>The Russians called their astronauts cosmonauts.</i>
space cadet	The unlimited expanse in which everything is located.

space flyer	A block of type without a raised letter; used for spacing between words or sentences.
space pilot	An area reserved for some particular purpose.
space traveller	A blank character used to separate successive words in writing or printing.
spaceman	An astronaut.
spacewoman	A female astronaut. <i>Britain's first spacewoman Helen Sharman carried the Olympic torch.</i>

Associations of "Astronaut" (30 Words)

aerospace	The branch of technology and industry concerned with both aviation and space flight.
airline	An organization providing a regular public service of air transport on one or more routes. <i>Airline pilot.</i>
airport	Relating to or denoting light popular fiction such as is offered for sale to travellers in airports. <i>An airport thriller.</i>
alien	Supposedly from another world; extraterrestrial. <i>Principles that are alien to them.</i>
astronomer	An expert in or student of astronomy.
<u>astronomical</u>	Relating to astronomy. <i>He wanted an astronomical fee.</i>
astronomy	The branch of science which deals with celestial objects, space, and the physical universe as a whole.

cosmic	Inconceivably vast. <i>Cosmic matter.</i>
cosmogony	A theory regarding the origin of the universe. <i>Today the central questions of cosmology and cosmogony are being explored within the framework of the Big Bang theory.</i>
cosmography	The science that maps the general features of the universe; describes both heaven and earth (but without encroaching on geography or astronomy). <i>The cosmography of Ptolemy.</i>
cosmology	The science of the origin and development of the universe Modern cosmology is dominated by the Big Bang theory which brings together observational astronomy and particle physics.
cosmos	A system of thought. <i>The new gender free intellectual cosmos.</i>
extraterrestrial	A form of life assumed to exist outside the Earth or its atmosphere. <i>Searches for extraterrestrial intelligence.</i>
international	A player who has taken part in an international game or contest. <i>An international agreement.</i>
interstellar	Occurring or situated between stars. <i>Interstellar travel.</i>
lander	A space vehicle that is designed to land on the moon or another planet. <i>A lunar lander.</i>
lunar	Of or relating to or associated with the moon. <i>A lunar eclipse.</i>
macrocosm	Everything that exists anywhere.
microcosm	A community, place, or situation regarded as encapsulating in miniature the characteristics of something much larger. <i>The city is a microcosm of modern Malaysia.</i>
orbit	Put a satellite into orbit. <i>France has been orbiting satellites with her own launcher.</i>
planetary	Involving the entire earth; not limited or provincial in scope. <i>Planetary rumblings and eructations.</i>
shuttle	Transport in a shuttle. <i>A shuttle bus departs every 30 minutes.</i>
spacecraft	A craft capable of traveling in outer space; technically, a satellite around the sun.
spaceman	A person trained to travel in a spacecraft.

spaceship	A spacecraft designed to carry a crew into interstellar space (especially in science fiction).
star	Used in names of starfishes and similar echinoderms with five or more radiating arms e g cushion star brittlestar. <i>His golf destiny was written in the stars.</i>
universal	A thing having universal effect currency or application. <i>Some form of religion seems to be a human universal.</i>
universe	All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago. <i>They study the evolution of the universe.</i>
world	All of your experiences that determine how things appear to you. <i>His world was shattered.</i>
worldwide	Of worldwide scope or applicability Christopher Morley. <i>Of worldwide significance.</i>
