- *A person who is trained to travel in a spacecraft.*

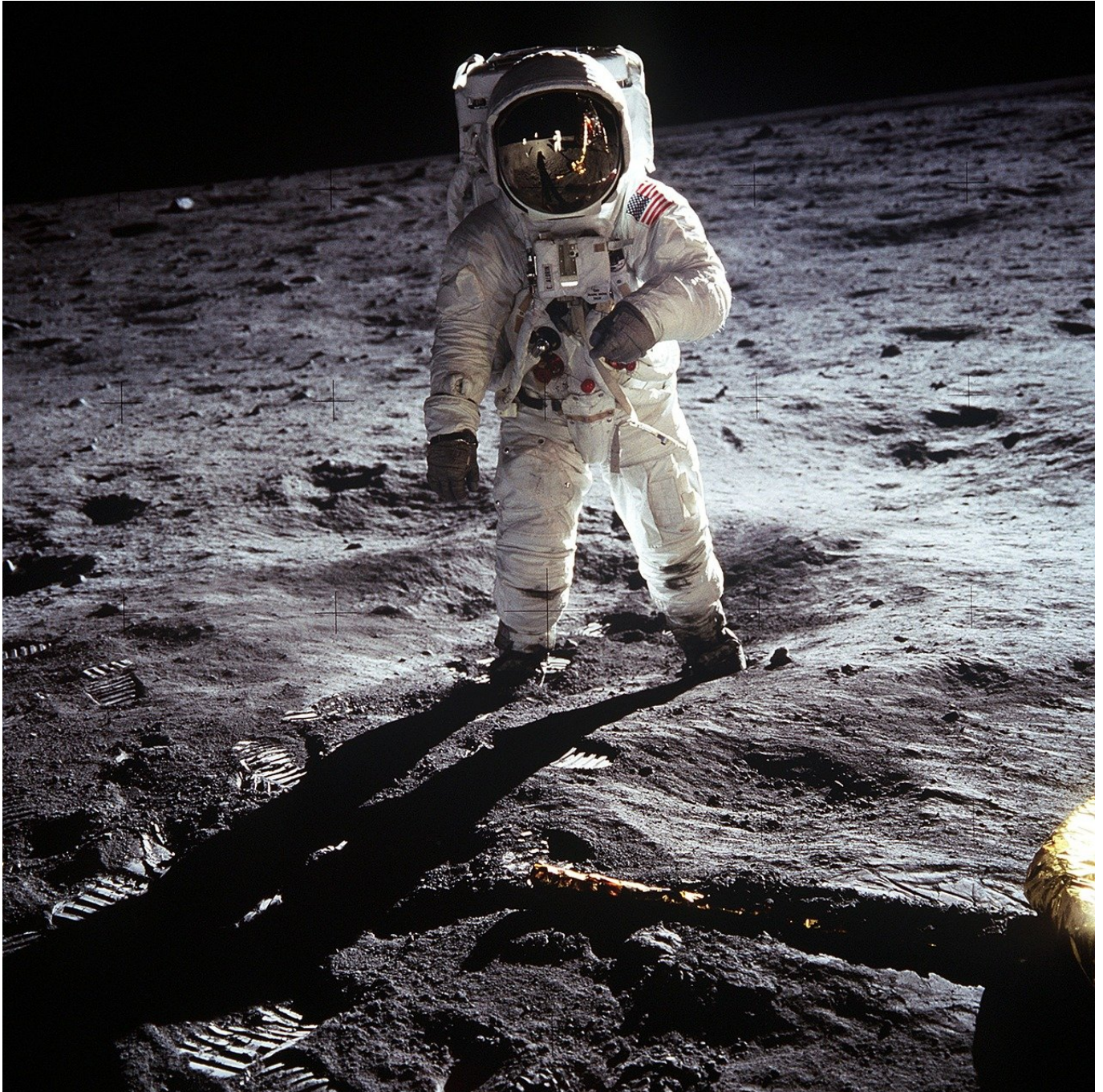


### Synonyms of "Astronaut" as a noun (7 Words)

- cosmonaut**      A Russian astronaut.  
*The Russians called their astronauts **cosmonauts**.*
- space cadet**      The unlimited expanse in which everything is located.

<b>space flyer</b>	A block of type without a raised letter; used for spacing between words or sentences.
<b>space pilot</b>	An area reserved for some particular purpose.
<b>space traveller</b>	A blank character used to separate successive words in writing or printing.
<b>spaceman</b>	An astronaut.
<b>spacewoman</b>	A female astronaut. <i>Britain's first <b>spacewoman</b> Helen Sharman carried the Olympic torch.</i>

## Associations of "Astronaut" (30 Words)

<b>aerospace</b>	The branch of technology and industry concerned with both aviation and space flight.
<b>airline</b>	An organization providing a regular public service of air transport on one or more routes. <i>Airline pilot.</i>
<b>airport</b>	Relating to or denoting light popular fiction such as is offered for sale to travellers in airports. <i>An <b>airport</b> thriller.</i>
<b>alien</b>	Supposedly from another world; extraterrestrial. <i>Principles that are <b>alien</b> to them.</i>
<b>astronomer</b>	An expert in or student of astronomy.
<b>astronomical</b>	Relating to astronomy. <i>He wanted an <b>astronomical</b> fee.</i>
<b>astronomy</b>	The branch of science which deals with celestial objects, space, and the physical universe as a whole.

<b>cosmic</b>	Inconceivably vast. <b>Cosmic matter.</b>
<b>cosmogony</b>	A theory regarding the origin of the universe. <i>Today the central questions of cosmology and <b>cosmogony</b> are being explored within the framework of the Big Bang theory.</i>
<b>cosmography</b>	The science that maps the general features of the universe; describes both heaven and earth (but without encroaching on geography or astronomy). <i>The <b>cosmography</b> of Ptolemy.</i>
<b>cosmology</b>	The science of the origin and development of the universe Modern cosmology is dominated by the Big Bang theory which brings together observational astronomy and particle physics.
<b>cosmos</b>	A system of thought. <i>The new gender free intellectual <b>cosmos</b>.</i>
<b>extraterrestrial</b>	A form of life assumed to exist outside the Earth or its atmosphere. <i>Searches for <b>extraterrestrial</b> intelligence.</i>
<b>international</b>	A player who has taken part in an international game or contest. <i>An <b>international</b> agreement.</i>
<b>interstellar</b>	Occurring or situated between stars. <b>Interstellar</b> travel.
<b>lander</b>	A space vehicle that is designed to land on the moon or another planet. <i>A lunar <b>lander</b>.</i>
<b>lunar</b>	Of or relating to or associated with the moon. <i>A <b>lunar</b> eclipse.</i>
<b>macrocosm</b>	Everything that exists anywhere.
<b>microcosm</b>	A community, place, or situation regarded as encapsulating in miniature the characteristics of something much larger. <i>The city is a <b>microcosm</b> of modern Malaysia.</i>
<b>orbit</b>	Put a satellite into orbit. <i>France has been <b>orbiting</b> satellites with her own launcher.</i>
<b>planetary</b>	Involving the entire earth; not limited or provincial in scope. <b>Planetary</b> rumblings and eructations.
<b>shuttle</b>	Transport in a shuttle. <i>A <b>shuttle</b> bus departs every 30 minutes.</i>
<b>spacecraft</b>	A craft capable of traveling in outer space; technically, a satellite around the sun.
<b>spaceman</b>	A person trained to travel in a spacecraft.

- spaceship** A spacecraft designed to carry a crew into interstellar space (especially in science fiction).
- star** Used in names of starfishes and similar echinoderms with five or more radiating arms e g cushion star brittlestar.  
*His golf destiny was written in the **stars**.*
- universal** A thing having universal effect currency or application.  
*Some form of religion seems to be a human **universal**.*
- universe** All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago.  
*They study the evolution of the **universe**.*
- world** All of your experiences that determine how things appear to you.  
*His **world** was shattered.*
- worldwide** Of worldwide scope or applicability Christopher Morley.  
*Of **worldwide** significance.*
