aquarius	A person who is born while the sun is in Aquarius.
<u>asterisk</u>	Mark with an asterisk. <i>He had asterisked the things about the case that still bothered him.</i>
<u>astral</u>	Relating to a supposed non-physical realm of existence to which various psychic and paranormal phenomena are ascribed, and in which the physical human body is said to have a counterpart. <i>Astral navigation.</i>
astrologer	Someone who predicts the future by the positions of the planets and sun and Moon. <i>He was advised by astrologers to delay his departure.</i>
<u>astrology</u>	The study of the movements and relative positions of celestial bodies interpreted as having an influence on human affairs and the natural world.
<u>astronaut</u>	A person who is trained to travel in a spacecraft. <i>The Russians called their astronauts cosmonauts.</i>
astronomer	A physicist who studies astronomy.
astronomy	The branch of science which deals with celestial objects, space, and the physical universe as a whole.
binoculars	An optical instrument designed for simultaneous use by both eyes.
<u>cosmic</u>	Inconceivably vast. <i>The cosmic void.</i>
cosmogony	A theory regarding the origin of the universe. <i>In their cosmogony the world was thought to be a square flat surface.</i>
cosmography	The science that maps the general features of the universe; describes both heaven and earth (but without encroaching on geography or astronomy). <i>The cosmography of Ptolemy.</i>

cosmology	The science of the origin and development of the universe Modern cosmology is dominated by the Big Bang theory which brings together observational astronomy and particle physics.
cosmos	A system of thought. <i>He sat staring deep into the void reminding himself of man s place in the cosmos.</i>
equinox	Either of the two celestial points at which the celestial equator intersects the ecliptic.
horoscope	A birth chart. <i>He gave lectures on astrology and cast horoscopes in his spare time.</i>
macrocosm	Everything that exists anywhere.
observatory	A building designed and equipped to observe astronomical phenomena.
observing	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
planetarium	An optical device for projecting images of celestial bodies and other astronomical phenomena onto the inner surface of a hemispherical dome.
planetary	Involving the entire earth; not limited or provincial in scope. <i>The planetary tilt.</i>
sidereal	Determined by daily motion of the stars.
spaceman	An astronaut.
star	Used in names of starfishes and similar echinoderms with five or more radiating arms e g cushion star brittlestar. <i>The starring role.</i>
stellar	Exceptionally good; outstanding. <i>Stellar structure and evolution.</i>
telescope	(with reference to an object made of concentric tubular parts) slide or cause to slide into itself, so that it becomes smaller. <i>A large portion of the past had to be telescoped and summarized for her.</i>
universal	A universal grammatical rule or linguistic feature. <i>The incidents caused universal concern.</i>
universe	All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago. <i>They study the evolution of the universe.</i>
virgo	The sixth sign of the zodiac; the sun is in this sign from about August 23 to September 22.
