<b>aquarius</b>	A person who is born while the sun is in Aquarius.
<b><a href="#">asterisk</a></b>	Mark with an asterisk. <i>He had <b>asterisked</b> the things about the case that still bothered him.</i>
<b><a href="#">astral</a></b>	Relating to a supposed non-physical realm of existence to which various psychic and paranormal phenomena are ascribed, and in which the physical human body is said to have a counterpart. <i><b>Astral</b> navigation.</i>
<b>astrologer</b>	Someone who predicts the future by the positions of the planets and sun and Moon. <i>He was advised by <b>astrologers</b> to delay his departure.</i>
<b><a href="#">astrology</a></b>	The study of the movements and relative positions of celestial bodies interpreted as having an influence on human affairs and the natural world.
<b><a href="#">astronaut</a></b>	A person who is trained to travel in a spacecraft. <i>The Russians called their <b>astronauts</b> cosmonauts.</i>
<b>astronomer</b>	A physicist who studies astronomy.
<b>astronomy</b>	The branch of science which deals with celestial objects, space, and the physical universe as a whole.
<b>binoculars</b>	An optical instrument designed for simultaneous use by both eyes.
<b><a href="#">cosmic</a></b>	Inconceivably vast. <i>The <b>cosmic</b> void.</i>
<b>cosmogony</b>	A theory regarding the origin of the universe. <i>In their <b>cosmogony</b> the world was thought to be a square flat surface.</i>
<b>cosmography</b>	The science that maps the general features of the universe; describes both heaven and earth (but without encroaching on geography or astronomy). <i>The <b>cosmography</b> of Ptolemy.</i>

<b>cosmology</b>	The science of the origin and development of the universe Modern cosmology is dominated by the Big Bang theory which brings together observational astronomy and particle physics.
<b>cosmos</b>	A system of thought. <i>He sat staring deep into the void reminding himself of man s place in the <b>cosmos</b>.</i>
<b>equinox</b>	Either of the two celestial points at which the celestial equator intersects the ecliptic.
<b>horoscope</b>	A birth chart. <i>He gave lectures on astrology and cast <b>horoscopes</b> in his spare time.</i>
<b>macrocosm</b>	Everything that exists anywhere.
<b>observatory</b>	A building designed and equipped to observe astronomical phenomena.
<b>observing</b>	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
<b>planetarium</b>	An optical device for projecting images of celestial bodies and other astronomical phenomena onto the inner surface of a hemispherical dome.
<b>planetary</b>	Involving the entire earth; not limited or provincial in scope. <i>The <b>planetary</b> tilt.</i>
<b>sidereal</b>	Determined by daily motion of the stars.
<b>spaceman</b>	An astronaut.
<b>star</b>	Used in names of starfishes and similar echinoderms with five or more radiating arms e g cushion star brittlestar. <i>The <b>starring</b> role.</i>
<b>stellar</b>	Exceptionally good; outstanding. <i><b>Stellar</b> structure and evolution.</i>
<b>telescope</b>	(with reference to an object made of concentric tubular parts) slide or cause to slide into itself, so that it becomes smaller. <i>A large portion of the past had to be <b>telescoped</b> and summarized for her.</i>
<b>universal</b>	A universal grammatical rule or linguistic feature. <i>The incidents caused <b>universal</b> concern.</i>
<b>universe</b>	All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago. <i>They study the evolution of the <b>universe</b>.</i>
<b>virgo</b>	The sixth sign of the zodiac; the sun is in this sign from about August 23 to September 22.
