<u>apart</u>	So as to be shattered; into pieces. Joking <b>apart</b> they do a really remarkable job.
<u>away</u>	Out of the way especially away from one s thoughts. Wanted to get <b>away</b> from there.
cloven	Split, divided.
<u>diffuse</u>	Spread or diffuse through. The problem is how to <b>diffuse</b> power without creating anarchy.
<u>diffusion</u>	(physics) the process in which there is movement of a substance from an area of high concentration of that substance to an area of lower concentration. The rapid <b>diffusion</b> of ideas and technology.
<u>dispel</u>	Make (a doubt, feeling, or belief) disappear. The brightness of the day did nothing to <b>dispel</b> Elaine s dejection.
dispersal	The splitting up and selling off of a collection of artefacts or books. Colleges had made large <b>dispersal</b> s and the shops were filled with books.
disperse	Denoting a phase dispersed in another phase as in a colloid. Winds <b>disperse</b> d the radioactive cloud high in the atmosphere.
<u>dispersion</u>	The extent to which values of a variable differ from a fixed value such as the mean. The study looks at the <b>dispersion</b> of earnings with OECD member countries.
<u>disseminate</u>	Cause to become widely known. There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can <b>disseminate</b> and migrate.
dissemination	The act of dispersing or diffusing something. The <b>dissemination</b> of public information.
dissipate	(with reference to a feeling or emotion) disappear or cause to disappear. The concern she d felt for him had wholly <b>dissipate</b> d.
<u>dissolution</u>	Dissolute indulgence in sensual pleasure. The Prime Minister asked the queen for a <b>dissolution</b> of Parliament.
distract	Divert (attention) from something. It was another attempt to <b>distract</b> attention from the truth.
distribute	Be distributed or spread as in statistical analyses. <i>The journal is <b>distribute</b>d worldwide</i> .



diversify	Vary in order to spread risk or to expand. <i>Diversify a course of study.</i>
division	A group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. The new clause was agreed without a <b>division</b> .
effluence	A substance that flows out from something.
intersperse	Place at intervals in or among. The debate was <b>intersperse</b> d with angry exchanges.
partition	The act of dividing or partitioning separation by the creation of a boundary that divides or keeps apart. An agreement was reached to <b>partition</b> the country.
<u>scatter</u>	The scattering of light other electromagnetic radiation or particles. A <b>scatter</b> of boulders round the pothole mouth.
scattered	Lacking orderly continuity. A <i>scattered</i> clifftop community.
separate	Become separated into pieces or fragments. A bathroom and <b>separate</b> toilet.
separated	Separated at the joint. <i>His parents are <b>separated</b>.</i>
<u>separation</u>	The cessation of cohabitation of man and wife (either by mutual agreement or under a court order. <i>The damage that might arise from the <b>separation</b> of parents and children.</i>
<u>split</u>	A thing that is divided or split. Once again the family was <b>split</b> up.
<u>spray</u>	A pesticide in suspension or solution intended for spraying. Water <b>spray</b> ed into the air.
spread	Cover by spreading something over. A table <b>spread</b> with food.
<u>sprinkle</u>	A light rain. He <b>sprinkle</b> d his conversation with quotations.
strew	Cover (a surface or area) with untidily scattered things. A small room with newspapers <b>strew</b> n all over the floor.
