Associations of "Asunder" (30 Words)

apart	So as to be shattered; into pieces. <i>Joking apart they do a really remarkable job.</i>
away	Out of the way especially away from one's thoughts. <i>Wanted to get away from there.</i>
cloven	Split, divided.
diffuse	Spread or diffuse through. <i>The problem is how to diffuse power without creating anarchy.</i>
diffusion	(physics) the process in which there is movement of a substance from an area of high concentration of that substance to an area of lower concentration. <i>The rapid diffusion of ideas and technology.</i>
dispel	Make (a doubt, feeling, or belief) disappear. <i>The brightness of the day did nothing to dispel Elaine's dejection.</i>
dispersal	The splitting up and selling off of a collection of artefacts or books. <i>Colleges had made large dispersals and the shops were filled with books.</i>
disperse	Denoting a phase dispersed in another phase as in a colloid. <i>Winds dispersed the radioactive cloud high in the atmosphere.</i>
dispersion	The extent to which values of a variable differ from a fixed value such as the mean. <i>The study looks at the dispersion of earnings with OECD member countries.</i>
disseminate	Cause to become widely known. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can disseminate and migrate.</i>
dissemination	The act of dispersing or diffusing something. <i>The dissemination of public information.</i>
dissipate	(with reference to a feeling or emotion) disappear or cause to disappear. <i>The concern she'd felt for him had wholly dissipated.</i>
dissolution	Dissolute indulgence in sensual pleasure. <i>The Prime Minister asked the queen for a dissolution of Parliament.</i>
distract	Divert (attention) from something. <i>It was another attempt to distract attention from the truth.</i>
distribute	Be distributed or spread as in statistical analyses. <i>The journal is distributed worldwide.</i>

diversify	Vary in order to spread risk or to expand. <i>Diversify a course of study.</i>
division	A group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>The new clause was agreed without a division.</i>
effluence	A substance that flows out from something.
intersperse	Place at intervals in or among. <i>The debate was interspersed with angry exchanges.</i>
partition	The act of dividing or partitioning separation by the creation of a boundary that divides or keeps apart. <i>An agreement was reached to partition the country.</i>
scatter	The scattering of light other electromagnetic radiation or particles. <i>A scatter of boulders round the pothole mouth.</i>
scattered	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>A scattered clifftop community.</i>
separate	Become separated into pieces or fragments. <i>A bathroom and separate toilet.</i>
separated	Separated at the joint. <i>His parents are separated.</i>
separation	The cessation of cohabitation of man and wife (either by mutual agreement or under a court order). <i>The damage that might arise from the separation of parents and children.</i>
split	A thing that is divided or split. <i>Once again the family was split up.</i>
spray	A pesticide in suspension or solution intended for spraying. <i>Water sprayed into the air.</i>
spread	Cover by spreading something over. <i>A table spread with food.</i>
sprinkle	A light rain. <i>He sprinkled his conversation with quotations.</i>
strew	Cover (a surface or area) with untidily scattered things. <i>A small room with newspapers strewn all over the floor.</i>
