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Associations of "At first glance" (30 Words)

above	Appearing earlier in the same text. <i>Place a quantity of mud in a jar with water above.</i>
<u>ahead</u>	Ahead of time in anticipation. <i>I see the lights of a town ahead.</i>
antecedence	Preceding in time.
antedate	Establish something as being earlier relative to something else. <i>There are no references to him that would antedate his birth.</i>
anterior	Coming before in time; earlier. <i>The veins anterior to the heart.</i>
before	At or in the front. <i>With the cross of Jesus marching on before.</i>
<u>beforehand</u>	Ahead of time; in anticipation. <i>Rooms must be booked beforehand.</i>
eleventh	Coming next after the tenth and just before the twelfth in position.
fore	Near or toward the bow of a ship or cockpit of a plane. <i>The captain went fore or forward to check the instruments.</i>
<u>forefront</u>	The position of greatest importance or advancement; the leading position in any movement or field. <i>The Cotswolds were once at the forefront of woollen manufacturing in England.</i>
<u>forego</u>	Lose (s.th.) or lose the right to (s.th.) by some error, offense, or crime.
<u>foremost</u>	Situated closest to the bow. <i>He put his best foot foremost.</i>
<u>former</u>	Denoting the first or first mentioned of two people or things. <i>I take the former view.</i>
<u>front</u>	The part of a garment covering a person's front. <i>There was some good news on the jobs front.</i>

henceforth	<i>Henceforth parties which fail to get 5 of the vote will not be represented in parliament.</i>
hurtle	Move with or as if with a rushing sound. <i>The trucks hurtled them through the grassland to the construction sites.</i>
lunge	Make a lunge. <i>Billy lunged his spear at the fish.</i>
precede	Preface or introduce something with. <i>He let her precede him through the gate.</i>
precedent	A previous case or legal decision that may be or binding precedent must be followed in subsequent similar cases. <i>A precedent case.</i>
preceding	Existing or coming before. <i>The preceding pages.</i>
predate	Prey on or hunt for. <i>Here parish boundaries seem clearly to predate Roman roads.</i>
prefatory	Serving as an introduction; introductory. <i>In his prefatory remarks the author claims that.</i>
prematurely	Before the due time; ahead of time. <i>His son died prematurely.</i>
previous	Previous convictions a criminal record. <i>The previous owner.</i>
previously	At a previous or earlier time; before. <i>A previously unquestioned attitude.</i>
prior	The head of a religious order in an abbey the prior is next below the abbot. <i>He had no juvenile record no priors.</i>
seventh	Position seven in a countable series of things.
sixth	One part in six equal parts.
tenth	A tenth part one part in ten equal parts.
untimely	Too soon; in a premature manner. <i>Alcohol brought him to an untimely end.</i>
