antedate	Establish something as being earlier relative to something else. <i>A civilization that antedated the Roman Empire.</i>
anterior	Earlier in time. <i>An incident anterior to her troubles.</i>
before	During the period of time preceding a particular event or time. <i>He called me the day before but your call had come even earlier.</i>
beforehand	Ahead of time; in anticipation. <i>Should have made reservations beforehand.</i>
eighth	One part in eight equal parts.
eleventh	Position 11 in a countable series of things.
fifth	A quantity of liquor equal to one fifth of a United States gallon. <i>He was fifth out of several hundred runners.</i>
fore	The front part of something, especially a ship. <i>The captain went fore or forward to check the instruments.</i>
forego	Be earlier in time; go back further.
former	Having previously been a particular thing. <i>Former generations.</i>
forward	Moving forward. <i>The special issue has been moved forward to November.</i>
fourth	In the fourth place. <i>Fourthly you must pay the rent on the first of the month.</i>
front	Be or stand in front of. <i>He was well behaved in front of company.</i>

<u>henceforth</u>	From this or that time on. <i>Henceforth she will be known as Mrs Smith.</i>
introductory	Serving as an introduction to a subject or topic; basic or preliminary. <i>An introductory art course.</i>
ninth	Position nine in a countable series of things. <i>Going into the ninth they were a run ahead.</i>
<u>precede</u>	Preface or introduce something with. <i>Bill preceded John in the long line of Susan s husbands.</i>
<u>preceding</u>	Of a person who has held and relinquished a position or office. <i>The preceding pages.</i>
predate	Be earlier in time; go back further. <i>Here parish boundaries seem clearly to predate Roman roads.</i>
prefatory	Serving as an introduction; introductory. <i>In his prefatory remarks the author claims that.</i>
prematurely	Before the end of the normal period of gestation. <i>Prematurely grey hair.</i>
previous	Previous convictions a criminal record. <i>The previous occupant of the White House.</i>
<u>prior</u>	The head of a religious order in an abbey the prior is next below the abbot. <i>He had no juvenile record no priors.</i>
seventh	Position seven in a countable series of things.
sixth	One part in six equal parts.
tenth	A tenth part one part in ten equal parts.
third	In the third place. <i>Third we must consider unemployment.</i>
untimely	(of a death or end) happening too soon or sooner than normal. <i>His untimely death in military action.</i>
