about	(of quantities) imprecise but fairly close to correct. <i>Wandering about with no place to go.</i>
bit	The cutting part of a drill usually pointed and threaded and is replaceable in a brace or bitstock or drill press. <i>You could see everything All her bits.</i>
few	The minority of people; the elect. <i>It was designed for the discriminating few.</i>
fractional	Relating to or denoting the separation of a mixture into fractions. <i>A fractional share of the vote.</i>
half	Half a pint of beer or a similar drink. <i>Divide the cake in half.</i>
handful	A quantity that fills the hand. <i>Only a handful of responses were received.</i>
inconsiderable	Too small or unimportant to merit attention. <i>A not inconsiderable amount of money.</i>
iota	The ninth letter of the Greek alphabet (I, ι), transliterated as ‘i’. <i>Nothing she said seemed to make an iota of difference.</i>
less	Comparative of little. <i>Of less importance.</i>
little	Used in names of animals and plants that are smaller than related kinds e g little grebe. <i>Little a.</i>
marginal	Just barely adequate or within a lower limit. <i>Water lilies and marginal aquatics.</i>
mini	Denoting a miniature version of something. <i>A mini dress.</i>

<u>minimum</u>	The least or smallest amount or quantity possible, attainable, or required. <i>This can be done with the minimum amount of effort.</i>
<u>nearly</u>	Closely. <i>In the absence of anyone more nearly related I was designated next of kin.</i>
<u>negligible</u>	Not worth considering. <i>He said that the risks were negligible.</i>
part	The part played by a person in bringing about a result. <i>She can't bear to be parted from her daughter again.</i>
<u>partially</u>	Only in part; to a limited extent. <i>He was partially paralyzed.</i>
poky	(of a room or building) uncomfortably small and cramped. <i>Five of us shared the poky little room.</i>
<u>portion</u>	A part of something divided between two or more people; a share. <i>A portion of the jetty still stands.</i>
scintilla	A sparkling glittering particle. <i>A scintilla of doubt.</i>
<u>scrap</u>	Discard or remove from service a redundant old or inoperative vehicle vessel or machine especially so as to convert it to scrap metal. <i>She was wearing a short black skirt and a tiny scrap of a top.</i>
segment	Divide into segments. <i>Hammond and the others were filming a segment for his programme.</i>
semi	A semi trailer. <i>She pulled into the path of a semi.</i>
slight	Insult (someone) by treating or speaking of them without proper respect or attention. <i>A Council determined whether the Fort should be kept or slighted.</i>
<u>slightly</u>	To a small degree; not considerably. <i>A slightly built girl.</i>
small	Into small pieces. <i>The captain had been paying small attention.</i>
smattering	A small number or amount. <i>Edward had only a smattering of Welsh.</i>
<u>some</u>	To some extent quite a lot. <i>Have some milk.</i>
<u>somewhat</u>	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>Matters have improved somewhat since then.</i>
