Associations of "At peace" (30 Words)

calmly	In a sedate manner. <i>People living in the area reacted calmly to the incident.</i>
<u>calmness</u>	An absence of strong winds or rain. <i>Those who worked with him refer time and again to his calmness under pressure.</i>
cohesion	The state of cohering or sticking together. <i>The work at present lacks cohesion.</i>
composure	Steadiness of mind under stress. <i>He accepted their problems with composure and she with equanimity.</i>
<u>concord</u>	Arrange the words of a text so as to create a concordance. <i>A concord was to be drawn up.</i>
<u>envoy</u>	A messenger or representative, especially one on a diplomatic mission. <i>The UN special envoy to Yugoslavia.</i>
equanimity	Steadiness of mind under stress. <i>He accepted their problems with composure and she with equanimity.</i>
gently	With little weight or force. <i>A gently humorous account.</i>
<u>hush</u>	Be quiet. <i>Hush my baby.</i>
mediation	Intervention in a process or relationship; intercession. <i>They are offering sacrifice and mediation between God and man.</i>
nonviolence	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
pacific	The largest ocean in the world. <i>A pacific gesture.</i>
pacification	Actions taken by a government to defeat insurgency. <i>A wonderful skill in the pacification of crying infants.</i>

poise	Be motionless, in suspension. <i>The bird poised for a few moments before it attacked.</i>
quiet	Become quiet or quieter. <i>Molly spoke with quiet confidence.</i>
quietly	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>She spoke quietly to the child.</i>
quietness	Absence of noise or bustle; calm. <i>A voice disturbed the quietness of the night.</i>
quietude	A state of stillness, calmness, and quiet in a person or place. <i>It highlights her quietude and wise passivity.</i>
rapprochement	(especially in international affairs) an establishment or resumption of harmonious relations. <i>There were signs of a growing rapprochement between the two countries.</i>
reconciliation	The action of making financial accounts consistent; harmonization. <i>His reconciliation with your uncle.</i>
<u>restful</u>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The rooms were cool and restful.</i>
reticence	The quality of being reticent; reserve. <i>The traditional emotional reticence of the British.</i>
secretiveness	Characterized by a lack of openness (especially about one's actions or purposes).
<u>serenity</u>	The state of being calm, peaceful, and untroubled. <i>An oasis of serenity amidst the bustling city.</i>
<u>silent</u>	Not made to sound. <i>A silent house.</i>
<u>softly</u>	Used as a direction in music to be played relatively softly. <i>He whispered softly in my ear.</i>
stealth	(chiefly of aircraft) designed in accordance with technology which makes detection by radar or sonar difficult. <i>A stealth bomber.</i>
<u>stillness</u>	Calmness without winds. <i>An eerie stillness engulfed the camp.</i>
<u>tranquility</u>	An untroubled state; free from disturbances.
tranquillity	An untroubled state; free from disturbances. <i>Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the tranquillity of rural life.</i>
