avalanche	Engulf or carry off by an avalanche. An avalanche of mud.
averse	(usually followed by `to') strongly opposed. <i>Averse</i> to taking risks.
danger	A dangerous place. <i>He moved out of danger.</i>
dangerous	Able or likely to cause harm or injury. A dangerous criminal.
dare	Defy or challenge (someone) to do something. She dare s to dress differently from the others.
dicey	Unpredictable and potentially dangerous. Democracy is a dicey business.
flammability	The quality of being easily ignited and burning rapidly.
<u>forewarn</u>	Warn in advance or beforehand; give an early warning. I forewarn ed him of the trouble that would arise if he showed up at his ex wife s house.
<u>gamble</u>	Bet (a sum of money. We decided to take a gamble and offer him a place on our staff.
<u>hazardous</u>	Risky; dangerous. Skydiving is a hazardous sport.
imminence	The state or fact of being about to happen. The populace was largely unaware of the imminence of war.
<u>insecure</u>	Not safe from attack. A top model who is notoriously insecure about her looks.
jeopardy	A source of danger; a possibility of incurring loss or misfortune. <i>The whole peace process is in jeopardy.</i>



landslide	An overwhelming majority of votes for one party or candidate in an election. <i>They won by a landslide</i> .
neurotoxin	A poison which acts on the nervous system.
parlous	Greatly or excessively. The General s position was parlous .
peril	Put in a dangerous, disadvantageous, or difficult position. Jonathon peril led his life for love of David.
<u>perilous</u>	Full of danger or risk. A perilous journey south.
perilously	In a dangerous manner. Houses perched perilously on craggy outposts.
<u>pitfall</u>	A covered pit for use as a trap. The pitfall s of buying goods at public auctions.
<u>precarious</u>	Fraught with danger. A precarious truce.
radioactivity	The emission of ionizing radiation or particles caused by the spontaneous disintegration of atomic nuclei. <i>An escape of radioactivity.</i>
radium	The chemical element of atomic number 88, a rare radioactive metal of the alkaline earth series. It was formerly used as a source of radiation for radiotherapy.
<u>risky</u>	Full of the possibility of danger, failure, or loss. Their risky patter made the guests laugh.
stunt	Perform a stunt or stunts. The recovery of our industries is stunt ed by lack of funds.
threatened	Likely in the near future to become endangered. The spotted owl is a threatened species not yet an endangered one.
toxicity	The quality of being toxic or poisonous. The toxicity of a drug depends on its dosage.
unsafe	Lacking in security or safety. Drinking water in some areas may be unsafe .
venture	Any venturesome undertaking especially one with an uncertain outcome. <i>A joint venture between two aircraft manufacturers.</i>
volatility	Being easily excited. <i>The children have been exposed to the full force of her</i> volatility .
