| adhere | Be compatible or in accordance with. <i>They adhered to their plan.</i> |
| bonus | Anything that tends to arouse. <i>Big Christmas bonuses.</i> |
| bush | Vegetation growing in the bush. <i>Bush justice.</i> |
| dividend | An individual s share of a dividend. <i>Buying a rail pass may still pay dividends.</i> |
| drill | Make a hole in something by boring with a drill. <i>The troops were drilling.</i> |
| hammer | Beat with or as if with a hammer. <i>Hammer the silver into a bowl.</i> |
| harpoon | Spear with a harpoon. <i>Gilbert s father harpooned a five metre basking shark.</i> |
| impale | Transfix or pierce with a sharp instrument. <i>Impale a shrimp on a skewer.</i> |
| income | The financial gain (earned or unearned) accruing over a given period of time. <i>He has a nice home and an adequate income.</i> |
| invest | Make an investment. <i>Getting workers to invest in private pension funds.</i> |
| lace | Pass a lace or cord through a hole. <i>A lace collar.</i> |
| lance | A weapon resembling a lance used in hunting fish or whales. <i>Pain lanced through her.</i> |
| payment | The action or process of paying someone or something or of being paid. <i>Ask for a discount for payment by cash.</i> |

| pinch | Irritate as if by a nip pinch or tear. <i>I was pinched for dangerous driving last month.</i> |
| poke | Prod and stir a fire with a poker to make it burn more fiercely. <i>Don t forget to poke holes in the dough to allow steam to escape.</i> |
| porcupine | A large rodent with defensive spines or quills on the body and tail. |
| prickle | (of a person) react defensively or angrily to something. <i>The sound made her skin prickle with horror.</i> |
| prickly | Covered in prickles. <i>Prickly velvet seats.</i> |
| protrude | Of an animal cause a body part to protrude. <i>When attacking it protrudes its long snout.</i> |
| shareholder | An owner of shares in a company. |
| spear | Pierce with a spear. <i>The branch speared up into the air.</i> |
| spike | Render a gun useless by plugging up the vent with a spike. <i>His hair was matted and spiked with blood.</i> |
| spindle | A Eurasian shrub or small tree with slender toothed leaves and pink capsules containing bright orange seeds Its hard timber was formerly used for making spindles. <i>Chromosomes are distributed by spindles in mitosis and meiosis.</i> |
| spinous | Shaped like a spine or thorn. <i>The dorsal fin is spinous.</i> |
| spiny | Having spines. <i>A spiny problem.</i> |
| stick | Come or be in close contact with stick or hold together and resist separation. <i>Fever left him weak on his sticks.</i> |
| sticker | An adhesive label or notice, generally printed or illustrated. <i>She s a sticker.</i> |
| sting | Cause an emotional pain as if by stinging. <i>He felt the stinging of nettles.</i> |
| thorn | A thorny bush shrub or tree especially a hawthorn. <i>The issue has become a thorn in renewing the peace talks.</i> |
| transfix | Pierce with a sharp implement or weapon. <i>He was transfixed by the pain in her face.</i> |
