date	Sweet edible fruit of the date palm with a single long woody seed. <i>His date never stopped talking.</i>
deadline	The point in time at which something must be completed. <i>The deadline of 6pm passed without incident.</i>
expiration	The end of a period of time. <i>The expiration of the lease.</i>
expiry	The end of a fixed period of time. <i>An expiry date.</i>
extremity	That part of a limb that is farthest from the torso. <i>The peninsula's western extremity.</i>
february	The month following January and preceding March.
finally	Used to introduce a final point or reason. <i>Finally it is common knowledge that travel broadens the horizons.</i>
fortnight	A period of two weeks. <i>Most major tennis tournaments last a fortnight.</i>
hour	The distance travelled in one hour. <i>You can't turn him away at this hour.</i>
january	The first month of the year; begins 10 days after the winter solstice.
last	Especially in enumerating points lastly. <i>The last house in the village.</i>
may	Used to ask for or to give permission. <i>You may confirm my identity with your Case Officer if you wish.</i>
monday	The second day of the week; the first working day.
month	A period of time between the same dates in successive calendar months. <i>He paid the bill last month.</i>
morning	Every morning. <i>I've got a meeting this morning.</i>

noon	The middle of the day. <i>The service starts at twelve noon.</i>
passing	In sport the action of passing a ball to another team member. <i>Thousands mourned his passing.</i>
saturday	The seventh and last day of the week; observed as the Sabbath by Jews and some Christians.
season	A period of the year marked by special events or activities in some field. <i>New season s lamb.</i>
<u>secondly</u>	In the second place (used to introduce a second point or reason). <i>He was presented first of all as a hopelessly unqualified candidate and secondly as an extremist.</i>
sunday	First day of the week; observed as a day of rest and worship by most Christians.
termination	The action of terminating something or the fact of being terminated. <i>Workers were informed of the terminations on Wednesday.</i>
thursday	The fifth day of the week; the fourth working day.
time	The rhythmic pattern of a piece of music as expressed by a time signature. <i>His time for the mile was 3 49 31.</i>
tuesday	The third day of the week; the second working day.
wednesday	The fourth day of the week; the third working day.
<u>week</u>	The time spent working during a week. <i>The course lasts sixteen weeks.</i>
weekday	Any day except Sunday (and sometimes except Saturday). <i>The weekday rush hour.</i>
weekend	Spend the weekend. <i>Nobody wants to work on the weekend.</i>
<u>year</u>	A period of time occupying a regular part of a calendar year that is used for some particular activity. <i>In the year 1920.</i>
