extempore	Without prior preparation. An <b>extempore</b> speech.
<u>flicker</u>	Shine unsteadily. A <b>flicker</b> of a smile passed across her face.
freshen	Make (to feel) fresh. It didn t take long to <b>freshen</b> her make up.
glance	Throw a glance at take a brief look at. She only <b>glance</b> d at the paper.
<u>grin</u>	Express with a broad smile. A silly <b>grin</b> .
immediate	Immediately before or after as in a chain of cause and effect. Coronary thrombosis was the <b>immediate</b> cause of death.
imminent	Close in time; about to occur. In <b>imminent</b> danger.
improvised	Created and performed spontaneously or without preparation; impromptu. An <b>improvised</b> short speech.
impulsion	A strong urge to do something. <i>Attitudes changed under the <b>impulsion</b> of humanitarian considerations.</i>



<u>instant</u>	Instant coffee. <i>We can t promise instant solutions.</i>
<u>instantly</u>	Urgently or persistently. She fell asleep almost <b>instantly</b> .
minute	The distance covered in a minute by someone driving or walking. A <b>minute</b> inspection of the grounds.
nadir	The point on the celestial sphere directly below an observer. Asking that question was the <b>nadir</b> of my career.
nod	Signify or express greeting assent or understanding by nodding. The teacher <b>nod</b> ded when the student gave the right answer.
offhand	With little or no preparation or forethought. She had made these remarks <b>offhand</b> edly.
provisory	Subject to a proviso. A <b>provisory</b> clause.
short	A short sound such as a short signal in Morse code or a short vowel or syllable. <i>The electrical circuit had shorted out.</i>
smile	Express with a smile. He <b>smile</b> d at Shelley.
sojourn	A temporary stay (e.g., as a guest. <i>Her <b>sojourn</b> in Rome.</i>
<u>sparkling</u>	(of a drink) effervescent; fizzy. <i>Sparkling</i> snow.
stopgap	Something contrived to meet an urgent need or emergency. <i>Transplants are only a</i> <b>stopgap</b> <i>until more sophisticated alternatives can work.</i>
temporarily	For a limited period of time; not permanently. Symptoms may disappear <b>temporarily</b> .
transitory	Not permanent. Love is <b>transitory</b> but it is eternal.
<u>twinkle</u>	(of a star or light, or a shiny object) shine with a gleam that changes constantly from bright to faint. <i>The smile made her face crease and her eyes</i> <b>twinkle</b> .
<u>twinkling</u>	A very short time (as the time it takes the eye to blink or the heart to beat. <i>Twinkling</i> eyes happy smiles.
<u>wink</u>	An act of winking. <i>He <b>wink</b>ed at Nicole as he passed.</i>
